The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby announce that They have made an Order under Section 21 (1) of the Finance Act, 1948, namely the Purchase Tax (No. 1) Order, 1952. The Order relieves from purchase tax certain articles in the category of vessels designed for use primarily as containers for food or drink, and serving trays, bread boards, etc., which are at present chargeable at 100 per cent. by reason of being, e.g. in the form of figures decorated by hand-naiting. in the form of figures, decorated by hand-painting, etc.

etc. It does so by amending Part I of the Eighth Schedule to the Finance Act, 1948, which sets out the classes of goods chargeable with the tax, and provides that articles which are not chargeable under Group II by virtue of paragraph (i) of that Group shall not be chargeable under Groups 25 or 29. The alteration does not affect articles which are within the ambit of Groups other than 25 or 29 (e.g., Group 27, goldsmiths' and silversmiths' wares): these will remain chargeable under the appropriate Group:

unese will remain chargeaole under the appropriate Group: The Order also provides that articles shall not be chargeable at 663 per cent, under Group 29 if they are comprised in any other Group—e.g., if they are mentioned in any other Group as "Not chargeable under this Group". The superseded paragraph (b) of Group 29 excluded only articles which were chargeable under other Groups.
