Parish of Iver (No. 1) Diversion Order, 1952.

NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 19th day of February, 1952, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the Parish of Iver.

The effect of the Order will be to divert the public right of way running from a point near the southern end of Victoria Crescent Iver south-eastwards for a distance of approximately 50 yards to the corner of the hurdle fence dividing A. F. Dutton's Nurseries and the continuation of the footpath south-eastwards, to a line running southwards from the commencement of the footpath above described for approximately 33 yards and then eastwards for approximately 30 yards to link up with the aforementioned footpath.

Atherstone Rural District Council (Ansley Common No. 1) Diversion Order, 1952.
