"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Salisbury (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the disunion of the united benefice of Dinton with Baverstock in the diocese of Salisbury.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 12th day of August, 1924, and published in the London Gazette on the same day it was directed that the benefice of Baverstock and the benefice of Dinton should be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls but that the parishes of the said benefices should continue distinct in all respects:

"And whereas in pursuance of the said Order the union of the said benefices took effect upon the 12th day of August, 1924:

"And whereas the Bishop of the said diocese of Salisbury has forwarded to us, the said Church Commissioners, provisional proposals pursuant to the said Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, recommending that the union of the said benefices should be dissolved, that the said benefice of Dinton should be held in plurality with the united benefice of Teffont Evias with Teffont Magna and that the said benefice of Baverstock should be held in plurality with the benefice of Barford, Saint Martin, all of which benefices are situate in the said diocese of Salisbury:

"And whereas effect can be given to the said proposals so far as they relate to the dissolution of the said union by Scheme prepared by us and confirmed by Order of Your Majesty in Council pursuant to the said Union of Benefices Measures and in so far as they relate to the said pluralities by subsequent Orders made by the said Bishop pursuant to the said Pastoral Reorganisation Measure:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. The union of the benefice of Dinton and the benefice of Baverstock in the said united benefice of Dinton with Baverstock shall be dissolved and the said benefices of Dinton and Baverstock shall thereupon each become a separate benefice with cure of souls within the limits of its separate parish.

"2. The disunion of the said united benefice shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said united benefice occurring after the date when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette.

"3. The parsonage house of the said united benefice shall belong to the benefice of Baverstock.

"4. The endowments and property of the said united benefice shall be divided and distributed as follows, that is to say,

(i) a capital fund of £7,335 10s. 7d., being part of a larger capital fund held by us, the said Church Commissioners, on behalf of the said united benefice,

(ii) the following sums of stock also held by us on behalf of the said united benefice, namely £85 19s. 1d. 2½ per cent. Consolidated Stock and £16 2s. 8d. 3 per cent. Savings Bonds (1960-70) or such sums of money in lieu of the same sums of stock as may be appropriated by us to the said united benefice in pursuance of the Benefices (Stabilization of Incomes) Measure, 1951, and

(iii) all the glebe lands now belonging to the said united benefice and situate in the parish of Baverstock,

shall be assigned and annexed to the benefice of Baverstock and all other the endowments and property of the said united benefice shall be assigned and annexed to the benefice of Dinton.

"5. The alternate patron of the said united benefice who was formerly sole patron of the benefice of Dinton shall be the patron of the said benefice of Dinton and the alternate patron of the said united benefice who was formerly sole patron of the benefice of Baverstock shall be the patron of the said benefice of Baverstock."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

" 1. *Constitution* :

" (a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a Minister, the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

" (b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the said area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

" (a) All that part of the parish of Saint Andrew, Mottingham (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto), which is bounded upon the south partly by the parish of The Annunciation, Chislehurst, and partly by the parish of Christ Church, Chislehurst (both of which parishes are situated in the diocese of Rochester), upon the west by the parish of Saint Augustine, Grove Park, Lee, and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Andrew, Mottingham, from the parish of Saint Augustine, Grove Park, Lee, at the western end of the wall or fence at the rear of the house and premises known as No. 73, Dunkery Road and continuing thence eastwards along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as numbers 73 to 127 (odd) Dunkery Road, and continuing thence southwards along the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the house and premises known as No. 127, Dunkery Road to a point opposite its southern end in the middle of Dunkery Road and continuing thence eastwards along the middle of Dunkery Road to a point in the middle of Court Farm Road and continuing thence northwards along the middle of Court Farm Road to a point opposite the western end of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the house and premises known as No. 141, Court Farm Road and continuing thence eastwards to and along the last-mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as Nos. 129 to 199 (odd), Dunkery Road and along the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the house and premises known as No. 114, Beaconsfield Road to a point opposite the eastern end of the last-mentioned wall or fence in the middle of Beaconsfield Road and continuing thence northwards along the middle of Beaconsfield Road to a point opposite the wall or fence which divides close numbered 296 on the map annexed hereto from close numbered 306 and continuing thence eastwards to and along the walls or fences which divide closes numbered 296 and 295 from close numbered 306 and along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as Nos. 44 to 2 (even), Widecombe Road and Nos. 16, 14 and 12, Ravensworth Road, and continuing thence northeastwards along the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the house and premises known as No. 200, Mottingham Road to a point opposite its northeastern end in the middle of Mottingham Road and continuing thence southeastwards along the middle of Mottingham Road to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Andrew, Mottingham, from the parish of The Annunciation, Chislehurst.

" (b) All that adjacent part of the parish of Saint Augustine, Grove Park, Lee (coloured green on the map annexed thereto), which is bounded upon the north and east by the parish of Saint Andrew, Mottingham, upon the south by the parish of Saint Andrew, Bromley, and upon the west by an imaginary line commencing at a point on

boundary which divides the parish of Saint Andrew, Bromley, from the parish of Saint Augustine, Grove Park, Lee, in the middle of Marvels Lane, and continuing thence northwards along the middle of Marvels Lane to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Augustine, Grove Park, Lee, from the parish of Saint Andrew, Mottingham."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwark.

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied (1) that it is desirable that the boundaries of the parish of Preston, of the parish of Saint Matthias, Preston, Brighton, and of the parish of Patcham should be altered in the manner described in Part I of the subjoined Schedule and as delineated on the map hereto annexed and (2) that the spiritual interests of the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the said map would be best served by constituting it a new parish and that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area described in Part II of the said Schedule as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester, (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. As from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme, the boundaries of the parish of Preston, of the parish of Saint Matthias, Preston, Brighton, and of the parish of Patcham shall be altered in the manner described in Part I of the said Schedule and as delineated on the said map.

"2.—(a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a minister, the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the said map shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

Part 1.

"(a) The territory (shown by the green colour on the map) to be annexed to the parish of Preston:—

"All that part of the parish of Patcham which is bounded upon the south-west and south by the parish of Preston and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Patcham from the parish of Preston in the middle of Surrenden Road and continuing thence northwards along the middle of Surrenden Road to a point opposite the middle of the eastern end of Varndean Road and continuing thence westwards to and along the middle of Varndean Road to a point opposite the southern end of the walls or fences on the western side of the grounds attached to the houses and premises known as Varndean and Fairlie Place and continuing thence northwards to and along the last mentioned walls or fences to a point at the eastern end of the wall or fence on the southern side of the grounds attached to the houses and premises known as Laine House and Effingham Lodge and continuing thence westwards along the last-mentioned walls or fences to a point opposite their western end in the middle of London Road and continuing thence southwards along the middle of London Road to the boundary which divides the parish of Patcham from the parish of Preston.

"(b) The territory (shown by the brown colour on the map) to be annexed to the parish of Saint Matthias, Preston, Brighton:—

"All that part of the parish of Patcham which lies to the south-east of the middles of Balfour Road and Ditchling Road.

Part II.

"The area comprising:—

"All those parts of the parishes of Patcham and Falmer (shown by the pink and blue colours respectively on the map) (the part of the parish of Falmer being a part of a detached portion of the said parish) which, taken together, are bounded on the south by the parish of Preston and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Patcham from the parish of Preston in the middle of Surrenden Road and continuing thence northwards along the middle of Surrenden Road to a point opposite the middle of the eastern end of Vardean Road and continuing thence westwards to and along the middle of Vardean Road to a point opposite the southern end of the walls or fences on the western side of the grounds attached to the houses and premises known as Vardean and Fairlie Place and continuing thence northwards to and along the last-mentioned walls or fences to a point at the eastern end of the wall or fence on the southern side of the grounds attached to the houses and premises known as Laine House and Eflingham Lodge and continuing thence westwards along the last-mentioned walls or fences to a point opposite their western end in the middle of London Road and continuing thence northwards along the middle of London Road to a point opposite the middle of the south-western end of Carden Avenue and continuing thence generally north-eastwards to and along the middle of Carden Avenue to a point in the middle of Ditchling Road opposite the north-eastern end of Carden Avenue at the junction of Carden Avenue, Ditchling Road and Colddean Lane (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the parish of Patcham from the aforementioned detached portion of the parish of Falmer) and continuing thence first southwards, then south-westwards and then southwards again along the middle of Ditchling Road (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the parish of Patcham from the parish of Saint Andrew, Moulsecobomb) to a point opposite the middle of the north-eastern end of Balfour Road, and continuing thence south-westwards along the middle of Balfour Road to the boundary which divides the parish of Patcham from the parish of Preston."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chichester.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* If upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme is published in the London Gazette both of the said benefices shall be vacant, the union shall forthwith take effect; and if upon that day the benefice of Leckford only shall be vacant, the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the benefice of Longstock.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Longstock shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"4. *Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.* The united benefice shall be in the archdeaconry of Basingstoke and in the rural deanery of Andover.

"5. *Diversion of endowments.* Upon the union taking effect a part of the endowments of the united benefice, namely, a capital sum of £1,886, being a part of a larger capital sum at present held by us, the said Church Commissioners, for the benefit of the benefice of Longstock, shall be severed and diverted from the benefice of Longstock and from the united benefice of Longstock with Leckford and shall be transferred to and be held by us, the said Church Commissioners, as part of and for the benefit of our General Fund and in consideration of the said transfer we shall make out of the said General Fund such periodical payments to the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Winchester as we from time to time determine to be equitable having regard to the value of the said endowments."

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Stoke-in-Teignhead and the benefice of Combe-in-Teignhead shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Stoke-in-Teignhead and Combe-in-Teignhead', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to

the benefice of Combe-in-Teignhead shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice, and the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Stoke-in-Teignhead and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith, if at the date when the union takes effect they have not already been sold under the provisions of the Parsonages Measures, 1938 and 1947, shall, as soon as conveniently may be, be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and in either case the net proceeds of any such sale shall be added to and dealt with in the same manner and for the same purpose as the capital sum of £8,335 17s. 6d. referred to in Clause 5 hereof.

"4. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Stoke-in-Teignhead having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

On 12th November, 1951, when a stoker in the boiler-room of H.M.S. CUMBERLAND opened the master-valve, the valve cover blew out and steam gushed into the boiler-room, badly scalding the stoker. The injured man was lying on an upper grating, and Petty Officer Stoker Mechanic WATT, on hearing and seeing the accident, immediately went to his aid, having to pass through the steam blowing at 250 lbs. per square inch to do so. He forced the stoker to jump off the grating with him on to a walk about eight feet below, and then pulled him to the forward end of the steam-filled boiler-room, from where he was brought out to safety.

In helping the injured man, Petty Officer Stoker Mechanic WATT was very badly scalded. He had shown complete disregard of his own safety, although he must have been fully aware of the danger to which he unhesitatingly exposed himself in going to the aid of the rating.
