Confirmation of Byelaws.

NOTICE is hereby given that it is the intention of the Mayor, Aldermen and Councillors of the Metropolitan Borough of Holborn, to apply to the Secretary of State for confirmation until the 1st day of April 1954 of Byelaws Nos. 21 and 22 made by the Council at their meeting held on the 27th day of February 1952 in pursuance of the powers contained in Part IV of the London County Council (General Powers) Act 1947, governing:

(i) The charges which may be made to street traders under Section 26 of the said Act for the removal of refuse or other services and in respect of expenses incurred in the administration of Part IV of the said Act, and in the cleansing of the streets in which street trading takes place;

(ii) The fees which may be charged under Section 23 of the said Act to applicants for temporary licences.

Notice is also given that the said Borough Council intend at the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this Notice, to apply to the Secretary of State for confirmation of the said Byelaws. Copies of the said Byelaws are deposited at the office of the said Borough Council at the Town Hall, 197, High Holborn, London, W.C.1, and are open to inspection by any ratepayer or street trader in the Borough without fee or reward during the usual office hours for the above-mentioned period of one calendar month.

LONDON COUNTY COUNCIL (GENERAL POWERS) ACT, 1947.

Part IV—Regulation of Street Trading.

Charges for Removal of Refuse, etc.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Hammersmith Metropolitan Borough Council, in pursuance of the provisions of Section 27 of the London County Council (General Powers) Act, 1947, have made the following Bye-law with respect to trading in streets within the Borough by Licensed Street Traders, viz. :—

“The amount of the charges which the Council are authorised to make under section 26 of the Act for the removal of refuse or other services rendered by them, and in respect of expenses incurred by them in the administration of Part IV of the Act, and in the cleansing of the streets in which street trading takes place, shall not exceed the following weekly rates:—

2s. 6d. in respect of each receptacle for which a licence is held for one or two days only in each week ;

5s. 0d. in respect of each receptacle for which a licence is held for three or four days only in each week ;

6s. 3d. in respect of each receptacle for which a licence is held for five or more days in each week.

This Bye-law shall cease to be in force after the 1st April, 1954, unless a Bye-law confirming and continuing its provisions has been duly made and comes into force before that date.”

Notice is hereby also given that it is the intention of the Council to apply on or after the 29th March, 1952, to the Secretary of State for the Home Department for confirmation of the Bye-law, as required by section 147 of the London Government Act, 1939.
