At the Court at *Clarence House*, the 10th day of *March*, 1952.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 27th day of February, 1952 (N. 1180/52) in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Forces to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing the date of 8th of October, 1948, sanction was given for the introduction of Junior ratings in certain branches in order to provide for the recruitment of youths below the age of 17½ in those branches:

"And whereas we consider it necessary to make similar provision for the Seaman Branch and for the Communication Branch:

"We humbly beg leave to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the introduction of the following new ratings:—

Junior Seaman
Junior Signaller
Junior Telegraphist

with rates of pay similar to those applicable to Boys entered in the Seaman and Communication Branches.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

Her Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Minister of Housing and Local Government, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of Little Waldingfield, in the County of West Suffolk, 10 days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by

subsequent enactments, made a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the Public Health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of Little Waldingfield in the said County of West Suffolk, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Housing and Local Government, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as follows, viz. :—

Little Waldingfield.—Forthwith and entirely in the Churchyard of the Church of St. Laurence in the said Parish.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 21st day of April next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 21st day of April.
