CUTLERY WAGES COUNCIL (GREAT BRITAIN).

The Cutlery Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of its intention to submit to the Minister of Labour and National Service proposals for the revocation of the Cutlery Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation (Holidays) Order, 1947 (Order C.T. (41)) as amended by the Second Schedule to the Cutlery Wages Council (Great Britain) Wages Regulation Order, 1951 (Order C.T. (49)) and for the making of a wages regulation order relating to holidays and holiday remuneration, in substitution for the provisions at present in operation.
