(e) Notices under the Trustee Act, 1925 (Executor and Administrator) in columnar form—15s. Other Notices under the Act at rates given under (f).

(f) All other Notices or Advertisements, including Applications to Parliament and Scotch Sequestrations, will

be charged by the number of lines appearing as plain matter in the type of the Gazette:-

If not exceeding 10 lines of printed matter-15s.

For each additional 5 lines or under-7s. 6d.

Table or tabular matter will be charged at the rate of £1 10s, per quarter page or part thereof.

(g) In Notices of Dissolution of Partnership, the signatures of the partners will not be charged for.
