WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 28th day of March, 1952, in the words and figures following, that is to say:---

"We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Church Patronage Act, 1870; and the Acts men-tioned therein, have prepared the following Scheme

for effecting a transfer of the interest hereinafter mentioned of Maude Mary Allford of Castle Barton, Tiverton, in the county of Devon, widow, (herein-after called 'the said Maude Mary Allford') in the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the churches and cures (hereinafter called 'the said united benefice') of Folke with Long Burton, North Wootton and Haydon, in the county of Dorset and in the diocese of Salisbury.

"Whereas we are tailistic that the right of patronage of and presentation to the said united benefice is exercisable in a series of five successive turns, of which the said Maude Mary Allford is entitled to one turn:

"And whereas the said Maude Mary Allford desires to transfer her said interest in the advowson of the said united benefice to the Dean and Chap-ter of the Cathedral Church of the Blessed Virgin Mary in Salisbury (hereinafter called 'the said Dean and Chapter of Salisbury') and is consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof she has executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

will telld to make better provision for the enter of souls: "Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Dean and Chapter of Salisbury (in witness whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Scheme) and with the consent also of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Salisbury as bishop of the diocese in which the said united benefice is situate (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Com-missioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publica-tion in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and with-out any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the said interest of the said Maude Mary Allford in the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said united benefice shall be transferred to, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said transferred to, and shall thereupon and thereform and thereform and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Dean and Chapter of Salisbury for ever." And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forth-with registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Salisbury.
