## Civil Service Commission, 29th April, 1952.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz.:

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF CARTOGRAPHICAL DRAUGHTSMEN.

1. Age Candidates must be at least 16 and under 31 years of age on 1st January, 1952, i.e., they must have been born on or after 2nd January, 1921, and on or before 1st January, 1936. But a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engage-ment in H.M. Forces may deduct the period of such service from his actual age.

2. Sex and Marriage (i) Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been estab-lished Civil Servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widowed or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity naid marriage gratuity paid.

#### 3. Nationality

Candidates must be British subjects. The also satisfy one of the following conditions:-They must

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is, or was at death, a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this para-graph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

Provided that a candidate will not be eligible for an appointment under the Ministry of Defence, Ad-miralty, War Office, or Air Ministry unless he or she is a natural-born British subject and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions of parents also born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions excent when the circumstances are such as to instifu except when the circumstances are such as to justify a departure from the general rule, in which case, provided the candidate satisfies the conditions pre-scribed by the preceding paragraphs, he or she may be admitted to competition or appointment by special permission of the Minister of Defence, First Lord of the Admiralty, Secretary of State for War, or Secretary of State for Air, as the case may be.

4. Qualifications (i) Candidates should have had a good general education with some training in elementary mathe-matics, geography and drawing or a modern language. Passes in these subjects, with English, at the School Certificate Examination or the General Certificate of Education, or Scottish Leaving Certificate or the equivalent examination in Northern Ireland will be an advantage. For posts in the following Depart-ments the qualifications required are:— Advisedty Concerct Certificate of Education or Scottish Leaving Certificate or the equivalent examination in Northern Ireland will be an advantage. For posts in the following Depart-ments the qualifications required are:—

Admiralty—General Certificate of Education or School Certificate, or equivalent, with passes in English, Mathematics and one other subject. Air Ministry—General Certificate of Education at ordinary level or School Certificate or equivalent in appropriate subjects.

War Office—General Certificate of Education or School Certificate or equivalent with passes in Geography and two out of the three subjects Mathematics, Art and a Modern Language.

(ii) Candidates who have left school recently must be able to demonstrate their aptitude for this class of draughtsmanship. All other candidates must have had at least one year's appropriate experience in a Drawing Office, except for posts in the War Office, where two years' experience in a Drawing Office will be expected.

## 5. Application

A candidate may make one, and only one, applica-tion under these Regulations.

Health and Character

Every successful candidate must satisfy the com-missioners as to his or her health and character.

7. Competition The Commissioners may summon to appear before a Selection Board all who are found to be prima facie eligible, or may, if they see fit, summon only those whose qualifications and experience are con-sidered to be specially suitable for the posts for which they are being considered. Candidates so summoned will be asked to bring examples of their

work to the Board. The Board will take into con-sideration the candidate's record of education and experience, any recommendation from persons named by the candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview; and on their estimation of all the above facts they will frame their recommendations. The decision of the Civil Service Commissioners shall be final.

#### Candidates trained as Teachers

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of equation authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

#### Assignment

Candidates will be required to state on their appli-cation forms for which Department or Departments they are competing. If a candidate is successful for more than one Department, the Commissioners will determine to which Department he shall be assigned, but his own wishes will be met as far as possible.

#### 10. Canvassing

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their Application Forms, will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recom-mendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at reference and the selectional institution in the Everes school or other educational institution, in the Forces, or otherwise.

#### 11. Fee

A successful candidate shall be required to pay a e of £1 before the issue of a certificate of fee qualification for appointment.

1. Extends the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Checkley, Crewe, Cheshire, declared by Special Order No. 49, 1952, and extended by Special Orders Nos. 55 and 58, 1952, so as to include the parishes of Stretton, Outwoods and Branston, and the County Borough of Burton-upon-Trent, Stafford. 2. Contracts as from 26th April, 1952, the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Elveden,

Suffolk, declared by Special Order No. 57, 1952, to an area comprising the districts situate within approximately 15 miles of Elveden.
