RECONSTRUCTION COMPETITION FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF ILLUSTRATORS IN VARIOUS GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS.

Candidates must be at least 21 and under 47 years of age on 1st January, 1952, i.e., they must have been born on or after 2nd January, 1905, and on or before 1st January, 1931. BUT

2. Sex.

Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

death, a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

Provided that a candidate will not be eligible for appointment to the Admiralty, or Ministry of Supply unless he or she is a natural-born British subject and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions, of parents also born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions, except when the circumstances are such as to justify a departure from the general rule, in which case, provided the candidate satisfies

the conditions prescribed by the preceding graphs, he or she may be admitted to competition or appointment by special permission of the First Lord of the Admiralty, or Minister of Supply, as the case may be.

4. Qualifications.
