WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 23rd day of April, 1952, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Peter, Bilton, and Marfleet, both in the diocese of York.

“Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

“And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cyril, Archbishop of York, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

“Now therefore we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Saint Peter, Bilton, and Marfleet shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

“ THE SCHEDULE.

“The territory (shown by the pink colour on the map) to be annexed to the parish of Marfleet:—

“All that part of the parish of Saint Peter, Bilton, which is bounded on the east by the parish of Preston in Holderness, on the south by the parish of Marfleet, on part of the northwest by the parishes of Saint Michael, Sutton in Holderness, and Sutton, and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point in the middle of Holderness Road on the boundary which divides the parish of Sutton from the parish of Saint Peter, Bilton, and extending thence northeastwards along the middle of Holderness Road for a distance of twentyeight and threequarter chains and continuing thence southeastwards in a straight line to the present Kingston upon Hull City Boundary and then generally southeastwards and southwards along the said Kingston upon Hull City Boundary to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Peter, Bilton, from the parish of Preston in Holderness.”

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to

ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 23rd day of April, 1952, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parishes of Saint Anne, Leicester, Saint Augustine, New Found Pool, and Glenfield in the diocese of Leicester.

“ SCHEME

“Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

“And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

“And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish;

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Guy Vernon, Bishop of Leicester (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. Constitution :

“(a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a minister, the area defined in the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

“(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

“(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be ‘The District (or Parish) of Saint Aidan, Leicester’.

“ 2. Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery :

“The parish shall be in the archdeaconry of

Leicester and in the rural deanery of Christianity (or Leicester).

"THE SCHEDULE"

"The area comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the parishes of Saint Anne, Leicester, Saint Augustine, New Found Pool, and Glenfield and the extra-parochial place known as Leicester Abbey (shown by the pink, green and brown and blue colours respectively on the map) which are bounded upon part of the east by the extra-parochial place known as Leicester Abbey, upon part of the north by the extra-parochial place known as Gilroes, and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the parish of Glenfield from the extra-parochial place known as Gilroes turns northwards (at the south-western corner of the extra-parochial place known as Gilroes) and extending thence southwestwards in a straight line to a point in the middle of the junction of Groby Road and New Parks Boulevard and continuing thence westwards along the middle of Groby Road to a point opposite to the northern end of the wall or fence which forms the western boundary of the house and premises known as 'Holmwood', Groby Road, and continuing thence southwards first to and then along the said wall or fence and the wall or fence at the rear of the house and premises known as number 1, Holmwood Drive, to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Augustine, New Found Pool, from the parish of Glenfield, and continuing thence first generally southwestwards and then southeastwards along the boundaries which divide the parish of Glenfield and the extra-parochial place known as Braunstone Frith from the parishes of Saint Augustine, New Found Pool, and Saint Anne, Leicester, to a point in the middle of New Parks Boulevard and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of New Parks Boulevard to its junction with Glenfield Road and continuing thence southeastwards along the middle of Glenfield Road to a point opposite to the south-western end of the wall or fence which divides the Western Park Golf Course Pavilion from the house and premises known as number 239 Glenfield Road, and continuing thence northeastwards first to and then along the last-mentioned wall or fence and the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as numbers 154 to 174 Letchworth Road to the north-western end of the wall or fence which forms the north-eastern boundary of the house and premises known as number 174 Letchworth Road and continuing thence southeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its south-eastern end and continuing in the same direction to a point in the middle of Letchworth Road and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of Letchworth Road for a distance of eight yards or thereabouts to a point opposite to the north-western end of the wall or fence which forms the north-eastern boundary of the house and premises known as number 143 Letchworth Road and continuing thence southeastwards first to and then along the last-mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as numbers 63 to 55 Hilders Road and continuing thence first northeastwards along the north-western boundary of the house and premises known as number 53 Hilders Road and then southeastwards along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as numbers 53 to 17 Hilders Road to their junction with the wall or fence which divides close numbered 92 on the map annexed hereto from close numbered 96 and continuing thence northeastwards along the last-mentioned wall or fence to its junction with the wall or fence which divides close numbered 93 from close numbered 96 and continuing thence eastwards along the last-mentioned wall or fence and the walls or fences which divide closes numbered, 93, 454, and 453 from closes numbered 94, 95, 455, and 458 and in the same direction to a point in the middle of Sandhurst Road and continuing thence northwards along the middle of Sandhurst Road to a point opposite to the middle of the end of Stephenson Drive and continuing thence northeastwards in a straight line for a distance of 418 yards or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the south-eastern end of Stokes Drive on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Augustine, New Found Pool, from the extra-parochial place known as Leicester Abbey."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Leicester.

DISCONTINUANCE

The Burial Grounds (Wolviston) Order, 1952

Made - - 29th April, 1952

At the Court at Windsor Castle the 29th day of April, 1952.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Minister of Housing and Local Government after giving 10 day's previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853 (16 & 17 Vict. c. 134), as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that for the protection of the Public Health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of Wolviston, in the County of Durham, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Housing and Local Government, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as hereinafter directed:

And whereas by an Order in Council of the 22nd February, 1952, Notice of such Representation was given, and it was ordered that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 21st day of April next, and such Order has been published in the London

Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. No new burial ground shall be opened in the said Civil Parish of Wolviston save with the previous approval of the Minister of Housing and Local Government, and burials shall be discontinued therein as follows, viz.:-

Wolviston.—Forthwith and entirely in that part of the Churchyard of St. Peter's Church, in the said Parish of Wolviston coloured green on the plan annexed hereto:

Provided that—

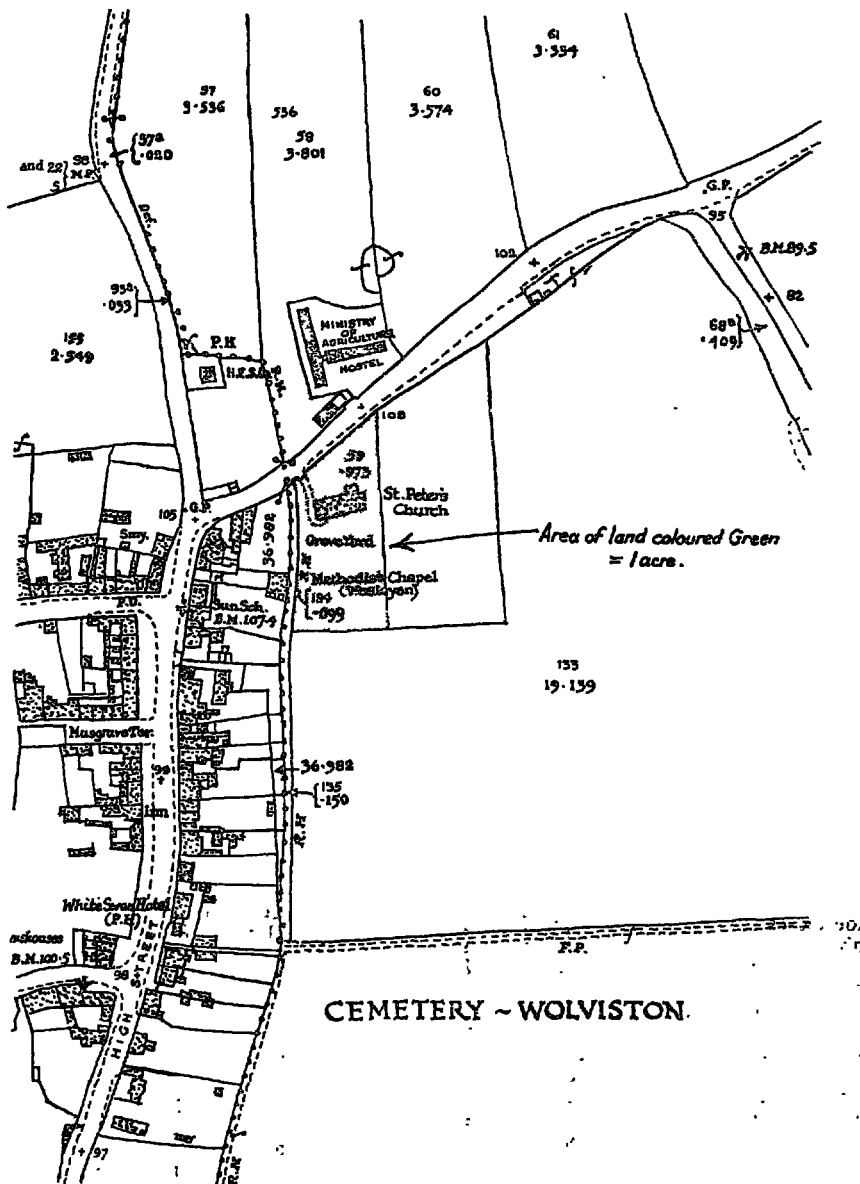
(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said part of the said Churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said part of the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Wolviston) Order, 1952.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz:—

RECRUITMENT UNDER NORMAL REGULATIONS TO THE SITUATION OF CIVIL HYDROGRAPHIC OFFICER IN THE HYDROGRAPHIC DEPARTMENT OF THE ADMIRALTY.

1. Sex and Marriage.

(i) Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid.

2. Age.

Candidates must be at least 21 and under 28 years of age on 1st March, 1952: but

(a) a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may deduct the period of such service from his actual age;

(b) a candidate who has served or is serving in H.M. Forces otherwise than on a regular or short-service engagement may deduct the period of such service from his actual age, up to a maximum of two years.

3. Nationality.

A candidate will not be eligible for appointment unless he is a natural born British subject and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions, or parents also born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions. No departure from this rule will be made without the special permission of the First Lord of the Admiralty and then only in exceptional cases and in favour of candidates who are British subjects

and who also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4. Qualifications.

Candidates must possess a good Honours Degree in either Geography, Mathematics, Physics, Engineering, Geology, or a kindred subject, or a qualification considered by the Commissioners to be equivalent for the purpose of this competition. All candidates must have reached at least matriculation standard in Mathematics or the ordinary level in Mathematics at the General Certificate of Education.

A reading knowledge of one or more foreign languages and an interest in Maps and Charts and Surveying methods will be additional recommendations.

5. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to their health and character.

6. Candidates trained as Teachers.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g. the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

7. Canvassing.

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them on their application forms, will disqualify them for appointment.

8. Competition.

The Commissioners may summon to appear before a Selection Board all who are found to be *prima facie* eligible, or may, if they see fit, summon only those whose qualifications and experience as shown on their application forms are considered to be specially suitable for the posts available. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidate's record of experience and education, any recommendation from persons named by the candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview; and on their estimation of all the above facts they will frame their recommendations. The decision of the Commissioners will be final.

9. Fee.

A successful candidate will be required to pay a fee of £3 before the issue of a certificate of qualification for appointment.

LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

LONDON PASSENGER TRANSPORT ACT, 1933.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport has made the following Regulations (S.I. 1952 No. 870) which come into operation on the 19th day of May, 1952:—

The London Traffic (Restriction of Waiting) (Walton and Weybridge) Regulations, 1952.

1. Save as provided in Regulations 3 and 4 of these Regulations no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day

other than a Sunday in any length or part of a road specified in the Schedule to these Regulations.

2. Save as provided in Regulations 3 and 4 of these Regulations no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday in Church Street, Weybridge, between its junction with Balfour Road and a point 106 yards south-west of that junction:—

(a) on the south-east side on those days of the month which bear even numbers;

(b) on the north-west side on those days of the month which bear odd numbers;

(c) for a longer period than twenty minutes; or

(d) if a period of less than forty minutes has elapsed since the termination of the last period of waiting (if any) of the vehicle in that length of road.

3. Nothing in Regulations 1 and 2 of these Regulations shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in any length or part of a road specified in the Schedule to, or Regulation 2 of these Regulations (which lengths and parts are hereinafter referred to as "the said roads") as often and for so long as may be necessary:—

(a) to enable a person to board or alight from such vehicle;

(b) to enable such vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other street, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any of the said roads or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near to any of the said roads of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraph or telephone wires, cables, posts or supports; or

(c) to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from such vehicle, provided that no vehicle being loaded or unloaded shall wait for a longer period than twenty minutes outside the same premises.

4. Nothing in Regulations 1 and 2 of these Regulations contained shall apply:—

(a) to fire engines, ambulances, or any vehicle in the service of a local authority or police force while such vehicle is being used as a matter of urgent necessity in any of the said streets; or

(b) to any vehicle which is being loaded or unloaded in any of the said streets with furniture.

SCHEDULE.

In the Urban District of Walton and Weybridge Baker Street, Weybridge, between its junction with Church Street and a point 67 yards east of its junction with Springfield Meadows.

High Street, Weybridge, on north-west side between its junction with Church Street and a point 53 yards north-eastward of that junction.

Queens Road, Weybridge, on south-west side between its junction with York Road and its junction with Princes Road.
