TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. Notification will be sent by post, on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part, and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

NOTICE OF SUBMISSION OF QUESTION BY THE MINISTRY OF NATIONAL INSURANCE.

Review of Certain Amounts Payable to Hospital In-patients.

Under Section 41 of the National Insurance Act, 1946, the Minister of National Insurance has asked the National Insurance Advisory Committee:

"In the light of changes in the cost of living which have occurred and of other relevant circumstances, to review the amounts specified in Part II of the National Insurance (Hospital In-Patients) Regulations, 1949, by which the benefits of persons in receipt of free in-patient treatment in a hospital or similar institution are to be reduced at the end of the first eight weeks and of the first fifty-two weeks of that treatment."

The Committee will take into consideration representations from organisations and individuals concerned with this question. Representations should be made in writing in the first place, and should be sent to the Secretary, National Insurance Advisory Committee, 30, Euston Square, London, N.W.1, before the 20th June, 1952.
