PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865 (28 & 29 Vict. c. 73), it is enacted that all pay, wages, pensions, bounty money, grants or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Her Majesty's naval or marine force to a person being or having been an officer, seaman or marine, or to the widow or any relative of a deceased officer, seaman or marine shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

And whereas Her Majesty deems it expedient to make further provision concerning retired pay, pensions and other grants for officers, nurses and ratings disabled, and for the widows and children of officers and ratings deceased, in consequence of service during the 1914 World War:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her as aforesaid and of all other powers whatsoever Her thereunto enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. In this Order the following expressions have, unless the context otherwise requires, the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them—

(1) "the 1920 Order" means the Order in Council of the 11th June, 1920 (S.R. & O. 1920 (No. 1021) II, p. 295), relating to seamen and marines, as amended by any subsequent Order in Council:

(2) "the 1921 (Officers) Order" means the Order in Council of the 9th March, 1921 (S.R. & O. 1921 (No. 360) p. 770), relating to commissioned and subordinate officers and nurses, as amended by any subsequent Order in Council:

(3) "the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order" means the Order in Council of the 9th March, 1921 (S.R. & O. 1921 (No. 361) p. 794), relating to commissioned officers from Warrant rank and warrant officers, as amended by any subsequent Order in Council:

(4) "the 1949 Order" means the Order in Council of the 29th September, 1949, as amended by any subsequent Order in Council.

2. For Part I of the First Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order, as amended by the 1949 Order, (which sets out the rates of retired pay for disabled commissioned officers) there shall be substituted Part I of the First Schedule to this Order.

3. For the figures in columns (2) to (5) in the Second Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order, as amended by the 1949 Order and by the Orders in

Council of the 28th October, 1949, and of the 31st March, 1950, (which sets out the rates of pension for the widows of commissioned officers) there shall be substituted the figures in the following columns:

4. For the Third Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order, as amended by the 1949 Order, (which sets out the rates of pensions for disabled nurses) there shall be substituted Part II of the First Schedule to this Order.

5. For the Table in the First Schedule to the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, as amended by the 1949 Order, (which sets out the rates of retired pay for disabled warrant officers) there shall be substituted the Table in Part III of the First Schedule to this Order.

6. In column (2) of the Table in the Third Schedule to the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, as amended by the 1949 Order and by the Order in Council of the 28th October, 1949, (which sets out the rates of pensions for the widows of warrant officers) for the figures £150 and £125 there shall be substituted the figures £168 and £143.

7. In column 2 of the Table in Article 11 of the 1920 Order, as amended by Article 22 (4) of the 1949 Order, for the figures 40s. 0d., 39s. 0d., 38s. 0d., 37s. 0d., 36s. 0d. and 35s. 0d., there shall be substituted the figures 47s. 0d., 46s. 0d., 45s. 0d., 44s. 0d., 43s. 0d. and 42s. 0d. respectively.

8. In the Tables in Articles 8 (7) and 13 (1) of the 1949 Order, for the figures 61s. 8d., 55s. 0d., 51s. 8d., 48s. 4d. and 45s. 0d., there shall be substituted the figures 71s. 8d., 65s. 0d., 61s. 8d., 58s. 4d. and 55. 0d. respectively.

9 For the Schedule to the 1949 Order (which sets out assessments of disablement and rates of pension for ratings) there shall be substituted the Schedule set out in the Second Schedule to this Order.

10. References to Commissioned Officers from Warrant Rank and Warrant Officers in the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order and in the 1949 Order shall after 4th April, 1949 be construed as references to Senior Commissioned Officers (Branch List) and Commissioned Officers (Branch List) respectively.

11. This Order shall, unless the context otherwise requires, be construed as one with the 1921 (Officers) Order, the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, the 1920 Order and the 1949 Order, as amended, and shall come into operation on the 1st May, 1952, so, how-

ever, that in relation to any award payable weekly the foregoing reference to the 1st May, 1952, shall be construed as a reference to the first normal weekly pay day for that award following the 1st May, 1952.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(*This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.*)

1. This Order makes further provision for retired pay and pensions for officers, nurses and ratings disabled, and for the widows of officers and ratings deceased, in consequence of service during the 1914 World War.
2. Articles 2, 4, 5 and 9 provide new schedules which have the effect of increasing the rates for 100 per cent. disablement by £26 a year in the case of officers and nurses and 10s. a week in the case of ratings, with proportionate increases where the degree of disablement is less than 100 per cent.

3. Article 8 applies the new rates for ratings to disabled ratings receiving approved treatment and to certain ratings entitled to awards in respect of service.

4. Articles 3, 6 and 7 have the effect of increasing the pension rates for certain widows by £18 a year in the case of officers and by 7s. a week in the case of ratings.

5. Article 10 gives effect in the appropriate Orders to a change of titles made by the Admiralty in April 1949—Commissioned Officers from Warrant Rank and Warrant Officers are now known as Senior Commissioned Officers (Branch List) and Commissioned Officers (Branch List) respectively.

And whereas Her Majesty deems it expedient to make further provision concerning retired pay, pensions and other grants in cases where the disablement or death of members of the naval forces is due to service after the 2nd September, 1939:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her as aforesaid and of all other powers whatsoever Her thereunto enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Order in Council dated the 29th September, 1949, relating to members of the naval forces as therein defined, as amended by the Orders in Council of the 28th October, 1949, and of the 31st May, 1951, shall be further amended in the respects set out in the following Articles of this Order, which shall be construed as one with the said Order of the 29th September, 1949, as so amended.

1. In Article 29 (3) (which provides for the award of pensions for unmarried dependants living as wives), for the figures £95 and 27s. 6d. there shall be substituted the figures £113 and 34s. 6d. respectively.

2. In Article 31 (2) (which provides for the award of pensions to widowers), for the figures £95 and 35s. there shall be substituted the figures £113 and 42s. respectively.

3. In subparagraph (a) of Article 40 (3) (which prescribes the amounts of "disablement addition on a pension basis"), for the figures £150 and £125 there shall be substituted the figures £176 and £151 respectively.

4. For the Tables in the Second Schedule (which set out the amounts of the yearly rates of retired pay for disabled officers and the weekly rates of pensions for disabled ratings) there shall be substituted the Tables set out in the First Schedule to this Order.

5. For the Tables in the Third Schedule (which set out the amounts of the gratuities or weekly allowances with or without terminal gratuities payable for disablement assessed at less than 20 per cent.) there shall be substituted the Tables set out in the Second Schedule to this Order.

6. For the Tables in the Fourth Schedule (which set out the amounts of the yearly rates of pensions for widows of officers and the amounts of the weekly rates of pensions for widows of ratings) there shall be substituted the Tables set out in the Third Schedule to this Order.

7. References to Commissioned Officers from Warrant Rank and Warrant Officers in the said Order of 29th September 1949, amended as aforesaid, shall after 4th April 1949 be construed as references to Senior Commissioned Officers (Branch List) and Commissioned Officers (Branch List) respectively.

8. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st May, 1952, so, however, that in relation to any award payable weekly the foregoing reference to the 1st May, 1952, shall be construed as a reference to the first normal weekly pay day for that award following the 1st May, 1952.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

1. This Order amends the Orders of the 29th September, 1949, as amended by the Orders of the 28th October, 1949 and the 31st May, 1951.
2. Articles 4, 5 and 6 substitute new Tables for those contained in the Second, Third and Fourth Schedules to the Order of the 29th September, 1949, and have the general effect of providing—
 - (a) for increasing pensions in respect of 100 per cent. disablement by £26 a year in the case of officers and by 10s. a week in the case of ratings, with proportionate increases where the degree of disablement is less than 100 per cent.;
 - (b) for increasing awards for cases of minor injuries and other cases of less than 20 per cent. disablement;
 - (c) for increasing the pensions of certain widows by £18 a year in the case of officers and by 7s. a week in the case of ratings.
3. Articles 1, 2 and 3 make provision for awards to be increased, as appropriate, in the case of unmarried dependants living as wives, widowers, and certain officers who are entitled to special awards of "disablement addition on a pension basis" with their service retired pay.
4. Article 7 gives effect in the appropriate Orders to a change of titles made by the Admiralty in April 1949—Commissioned Officers from Warrant Rank and Warrant Officers are now known as Senior Commissioned Officers (Branch List) and Commissioned Officers (Branch List) respectively.
