"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the *London Gazette* of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Saint James, Taunton; Staplegrove; and Saint Andrew, Rowbarton, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint James, Taunton:—

"All those contiguous parts (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parishes of Staplegrove and Saint Andrew, Rowbarton, which, taken together, are bounded upon the south by the parish of Saint James, Taunton, and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the parish of Saint James, Taunton, from the parish of Staplegrove, in the middle of Staplegrove Road, and continuing thence northwards along the middle of Staplegrove Road to a point opposite the southwestern end of the wall or fence which divides the grounds and premises belonging to Taunton School from close numbered 116 on the map annexed hereto, and continuing thence generally north-eastwards first to and then along the walls or fences which divide the grounds and premises belonging to Taunton School from closes numbered 116, 105 and 104 to their end, and continuing thence first south-eastwards and then southwards along the walls or fences forming the northern and eastern boundaries of the grounds and premises belonging to Taunton School to the end of the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the last-mentioned grounds and premises and continuing thence in the same straight line to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Andrew, Rowbarton, from the parish of Saint James, Taunton."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the *London Gazette* pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bath and Wells.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday the 6th June, 1952, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £240,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 9th June, 1952, to Saturday, the 14th June, 1952, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post, on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part, and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such
