NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER, DIVERSION ORDER OR EXTINGUISHMENT ORDER.

National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949.

Congleton Rural (Cinderhill-Odd Rode) Diversion Order, 1952.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 30th day of May, 1952, the Minister of Local Government and Planning confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert the public right of way running from Station Road, Kent Green, through Field No. 807 O.S. Ches. LVIII. to Cinderhill Lane, Kent Green, to a line running from a point approximately 93 yards from its present junction with Cinderhill Lane in an easterly and south easterly direction for approximately 117 yards to a new junction with Cinderhill Lane adjacent to the Council Houses.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at The Council Offices, Middlewich Road, Sandbach, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on weekdays and 10 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays.

The Order becomes operative as from the 1st day of June, 1952, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.
