

On arrival at Westminster Hall where members of both Houses of Parliament were present the Coffin was taken from the Gun Carriage by the Bearer Party of the King's Company, Grenadier Guards, and was received by the Archbishop of York, the Lord Great Chamberlain, the Earl Marshal, and the Minister of Works, and carried to the Catafalque prepared for it in the following order:—

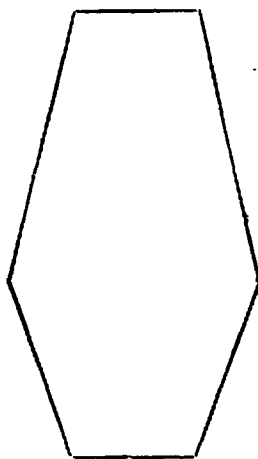

When the Royal Coffin had been placed upon the Catafalque HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN, Her Majesty the Queen Mother, and the other Royal Mourners stood at the head of the Coffin.

The Gentlemen at Arms and the Yeomen of the Guard took their customary places on either side, the Lord Great Chamberlain and the Earl Marshal took their stand at the foot of the Coffin.

The Service was conducted by the Archbishop of York, who stood by the head of the Coffin, facing the Royal Mourners.

After the Service HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN, Her Majesty the Queen Mother and the other Members of the Royal Family were conducted by the Archbishop of York, the Lord Great Chamberlain, the Earl Marshal and the Officers of Arms to the entrance of Westminster Hall.
