High Wycombe (Micklefield Road) Footpath Diversion Order, 1952.

WINSLOW RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

Winslow Rural District Council (Newton Longville Parish) No. 1 Extinguishment Order, 1951.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 19th day of June, 1952, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to extinguish the public right of way from a point opposite the Crooked

Billet Public House to a point adjacent to the Churchyard, Newton Longville.

DURHAM RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

Durham Rural District (Bearpark Footpath) Extinguishment Order, 1952.
