The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1951, viz. :—

The Hydrocarbon Oil Duties (Drawback) (No. 2) Order, 1952, which provides for the allowance of drawback of customs or excise duty paid in respect of hydrocarbon oils used in the manufacture or preparation of certain types of footwear containing rubber; certain rubber feeding bottle teats and valves and soother teats, dipped rubber enemas; enamelled rubber enemas; enamelled rubber bulbs and syringes; prophylactics, finger cots and finger stalls of the latex type; tennis balls and golf balls; printed and other linoleum and printed felt base. The drawback applies when the articles are exported, or shipped or deposited in warehouse for use as ships' stores, on or after 14th July, 1952.
