ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1934 (SECTION 1).

Speed Limit—London Traffic Area.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by subsection (4) of Section 1 of the Road Traffic Act, 1934, intends to make the London Traffic (Built Up Areas) (No.) Order, 1952, the effect of which will be to impose the 30 m.p.h. speed limit on the length of road specified in the schedule hereto.

SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (DEFENCE PURPOSES) ACT, 1951.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice of his intention to make an Order under subsection (1) of section 2 of the Supplies and Services (Defence Purposes) Act, 1951, the effect of which will be to authorise the stopping up of the following length of road within the Parish of Blyton in the Rural District of Gainsborough in the County of Lincoln (Parts of Lindsey):—

That length of the road from Blyton to Northorpe which extends from a point approximately 550 yards east of its junction with the Blyton—Laughton road in an easterly direction for a distance of approximately 450 yards.

The said Order will be made not less than 21 days after the publication of this Notice.

DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACT, 1950.

Notice is hereby given in pursuance of Section 85 (3) of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1950, that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the following Orders:—

Statutory Instruments 1952 No. 1312.

The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 121, 1952. (Made 9th July, 1952.)

Declares Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Areas around (1) Holywood, Dumfriesshire and (2) Gilsland, Carlisle, Cumberland, which replace and extend the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Holywood, Dumfriesshire, declared by Special Order No. 95, 1952, and extended by Special Orders Nos. 96, 103, 112 and 117, 1952.

Statutory Instruments 1952 No. 1318.

The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Controlled Areas) Special Order No. 16, 1952. (Made 10th July, 1952.)

1. Declares, as from 11th July, 1952, an area comprising the counties of Cumberland, Durham and Northumberland to be a Controlled Area for the purpose of preventing the spreading of foot-and-mouth disease, to which Area the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Controlled Areas Restrictions) General Order of 1938 are applied.

2. Provides that licences authorising the movement of pigs from any premises (other than premises situate within a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area) direct to a slaughterhouse or bacon factory situate within this Controlled Area may be granted by an Inspector for the Local Authority of the district in which the movement commences, and shall not require counter-signature by any other Inspector. The form of licence is set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order.

LAND DRAINAGE ACT, 1930.
