WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 20th day of June, 1952, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1938, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Spencer, Bishop of Peterborough (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Ufford with Bainton and the benefice of Barnack, both situated in the diocese of Peterborough.

"SCHEME

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Ufford with Bainton and the benefice of Barnack shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Barnack with Ufford and Bainton', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Colin Francis Scott, if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Barnack, shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the house at present under erection as a parsonage house for the benefice of Barnack shall become the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"4. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Ufford with Bainton having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

"5. *Diversion of Endowments.* Upon the union taking effect the endowments specified hereafter that is to say:—

"(a) a capital sum of £1,280 8s. 8d. producing a permanent annual income of £40 and now forming part of a larger sum held by us, the Church Commissioners, for the endowment of the benefice of Barnack and,

"(b) so much of the fund now held by us for the provision of a parsonage house for the benefice of Ufford with Bainton as shall remain after the expenditure of such sums as we may approve towards the cost of providing the parsonage house referred to in clause 3 of this Scheme,

shall be severed or diverted from the benefice of Barnack and the benefice of Ufford with Bainton respectively and from the united benefice of Barnack with Ufford and Bainton and shall be transferred to and be held by us, the said Church Commissioners, as part of and for the benefit of our General Fund and in consideration of the said transfer we shall make out of the said General Fund such periodical payments to the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Peterborough as we from time to time determine to be equitable having regard to the value of the said endowments."

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Ashe and Deane, both in the diocese of Winchester.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Alwyn, Bishop of Winchester, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Ashe and Deane shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Deane:—

"All that part of the parish of Ashe (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) which lies within the civil parish of Steventon."
