WHEREAS by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865 (28 & 29 Vict. c. 73), it is enacted that all pay, wages, pensions, bounty money, grants or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Her Majesty's naval or marine force to a person being or having been an officer, seaman or marine, or to the widow or any relative of a deceased officer, seaman or marine shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

And whereas Her Majesty deems it expedient to amend certain Orders in Council concerning retired pay, pensions and other grants for officers, nurses and ratings disabled, and for the widows and children of officers and ratings deceased, in consequence of service during the 1914 World War:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conterred upon Her as aforesaid and of all other powers whatsoever Her thereunto enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:

1. In this Order the following expressions have the

meanings hereby respectively assigned to them—
(1) "the 1920 Order" means the Order in Council of the 11th June, 1920 (S.R. & O. 1920 (No. 1021) II, p. 295), relating to seamen and marines, as amended by any subsequent Order in Council. Council:

5. Subparagraph (e) of Article 5 (3) of the 1949 Order (which provides for the award of an additional allowance for the first child of a rating) shall be deleted and there shall be substituted the follow-

ing subparagraph:—

"(e) In the case of a rating, the amount of the allowance in respect of the first child awarded under Article 4 of this Order or awarded or increased under subparagraph (d) of this paragraph may be increased or further increased to 10s. 6d. a week."

6. In Article 7 (1) of the 1949 Order (which provides for the award of an additional allowance to a disabled officer or nurse who is receiving approved treatment) for the figures 26s., wherever the same appear, there shall be substituted the figures 32s. 6d.

7. In Article 7 (4) (a) of the 1949 Order (which provides for the award of an allowance or increased allowance for the wife of an officer) for the figure £6 there shall be substituted the figures £20.

8. In Article 7 (4) (c) of the 1949 Order (which provides for the award of an allowance in respect of an adult dependant of an officer or nurse) for the figures £42 there shall be substituted the figures £56.

9. In Article 7 (5) of the 1949 Order (which prescribes the maximum for the aggregate of certain allowances for officers) for the figures £72 there shall be substituted the figures £86.

10. In Article 8 (3) of the 1949 Order (which provides for an award of an additional allowance for a disabled rating receiving approved treatment) for the figures 26s., wherever the same appear, there shall be substituted the figures 32s. 6d.

11. In Article 8 (4) (a) of the 1949 Order (which provides for the award of an allowance or increased allowance for the wife of a rating) for the figure 6s. there shall be substituted the figures 11s. 6d.

12. For subparagraph (b) of Article 8 (4) of the 1949 Order (which provides for the award of an allowance for a child of a rating) there shall be substituted the following subparagraph:

"(b) where it is in respect of a child, shall be at whichever of the following rates is applicable, namely—

(i) where an allowance is in issue under sub-paragraph (a) of this paragraph, 7s. 6d. a week for each child; or (ii) where an allowance is not in issue under subparagraph (a) of this paragraph, 10s. a week for the first child and 7s. 6d. a week for each other child:

Provided that, where an allowance is awarded under paragraph (3) of this Article, the allowance for the first child may be increased to 10s. 6d. a

15. In Article 15 (2) of the 1949 Order (which provides for the award of a pension to a motherless child of a commissioned officer or warrant officer) for the figures £60, £45 and £52 there shall be substituted the figures £64, £49 and £56 respectively.

16. In Article 15 (4) of the 1949 Order (which provides for the award of a pension to a motherless child of a rating) for the figures 13s. 6d. and 20s. there shall be substituted the figures 15s. and 21s. 6d. respectively.

17. In Article 15 (6) of the 1949 Order (which provides for awards to or in respect of a motherless child who has attained the age of 18 years and is incapable of self-support) for the figures £68 and 26s. there shall be substituted the figures £84 10s. and

32s. 6d. respectively.

18.—(1) This Order shall, unless the context otherwise requires, be construed as one with the 1920 Order and the 1949 Order and, subject to the following provisions of this Article, shall come into opera-

ing provisions of this Article, shall come into opera-tion as regards officers and nurses on the 1st August, 1952, and as regards ratings on the 23rd July, 1952. (2) Articles 15 and 16 of this Order shall come into operation on the 1st September, 1952. EXPLANATORY NOTE.

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

- 1. This Order amends the Orders of the 11th June, 1920 (S.R. & O. 1920 No. 1021) and the 29th September, 1949, as amended.
- 2. The normal maximum rate of the allowances payable for constant attendance is increased to 25s, a week in the case of ratings and the maxima for exceptional cases of very severe disablement to 50s, a week in the case of commissioned officers, warrant officers, nurses and ratings. (Article 2.)

3.—(1) The additional allowances payable in respect of the wife or adult dependant of an unemployable pensioner and of a pensioner receiving approved treatment may be increased to a total of £56 a year in the case of officers or 21s. 6d. a week in the case of ratings. (2) In the case of ratings, the allowance payable in respect of the first child of a pensioner who is unemployable or is receiving approved treatment and is not entitled to sickness benefit under National Insurance provisions is increased to 10s. 6d. a week. (Articles 5 and 12.)

Where such a child attains the age of 18 years and is incapable of self-support by reason of an infirmity which arose before he attained the normal age-limit for pension purposes, these rates may be further increased to £84 10s. a year in the case of children of commissioned officers and warrant officers and to 32s. 6d. a week in the case of children of ratings. (Articles 15, 16 and 17.)

The Order in Council dated the 29th September, 1949, relating to members of the naval forces as therein defined, as amended by the Orders in Council of the 28th October, 1949, of the 31st May, 1951, and of the 29th April, 1952, shall be further amended in the respects set out in the following Articles of this Order, which shall be construed as one with the said Order of the 29th September, 1949, as so amended.

"2. Taking effect of union. The union shall take effect upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette.

"3. Parsonage House. Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present under erection at Ashby Magna shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"4. Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery. The united benefice shall be in the archdeaconry of Loughborough and in the rural deanery of Guthlaxton I."

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of July, 1952, in the words and figures following, that is to say: "We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Spencer, Bishop of Peterborough (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the disunion of the united benefice of Clopton with Thurning and the union of the benefice of Luddington with Hemington with the benefice of Thurning all of which benefices are situate in the diocese of Peterborough.

" SCHEME.

"Whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 6th day of February, 1928, and published in the London Gazette on the 7th day of the same month it was directed that the benefice of Clopton and the benefice of Thurning should be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls, but that the parishes of the said benefices should continue distinct in all respects:

"And whereas in pursuance of the said Order and in the events which have happened the union of the said benefices took effect upon the 1st day of October, 1929:

"Now therefore we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Maistry as follows that is to say:

"1. Disunion of the united benefice of Clopton with Thurning.

"(c) Upon the disunion taking effect the right of patronage of the benefice of Thurning shall be exercisable by that one of the alternate patrons of the united benefice of Clopton with Thurning who prior to the union was patron of the benefice of Thurning and the right of patronage of the benefice of Clapton shall be exercisable by the other alternate patron of the united benefice of Clopton with Thurning.

"(d) The endowments and presents of the patronage of the patronage of the patronage of the united benefice of Clopton with Thurning.

"(d) The endowments and property of the said united benefice shall be divided and distributed as follows, that is to say, the endowments and property specified in Part I of the Schedule hereto shall be assigned and annexed to the benefice of Clapton and the endowments and property specified in Part II of the said Schedule shall be assigned and annexed to the benefice of Thurning.

"(b) The union shall take effect upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette and the Reverend Christopher Arthur Surrey if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Luddington is then incumbent of the said benefice of Luddington with Hemington shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice of Luddington with Hemington and

"(c) Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Luddington with Hemington shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"(d) After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the benefices of Luddington with Hemington and Thurning alternately, the patrons of the benefice of Thurning having the first turn.

"(e) Upon the union taking effect the united benefice shall be in the archdeaconry of Oakham and the rural deanery of Oundle I.
