

2½ per cent. of the third £9 11s. 8d. of weekly salary,

(b) in the case of persons whose salaries are calculated on an annual basis, the aggregate of the following sums, namely:—

10 per cent. of the first £500 of annual salary,
5 per cent. of the second £500 of annual salary, and

2½ per cent. of the third £500 of annual salary,

and such additions may be paid as from 1st January, 1952.

6. The sums payable under the provisions of this Order shall be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund.

7. The Interpretation Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict. c. 63), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order amends the Northern Lighthouse Board (Establishment) Order 1951 in the following respects:—

(1) It increases the engineering establishment of the Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses by the addition of a Radio Engineer.

(2) It increases the salaries payable to persons on the existing engineering establishment of the Commissioners by the introduction of a new scale of salaries.

(3) It provides for the payment of pay additions to the Secretary, the Senior Engineer, and all persons serving on the clerical or engineering establishments of the Commissioners.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 17th day of July, 1952, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1938, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Thomas, Bishop of Carlisle (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Kirkby Stephen, and the benefice of Mallerstang in the diocese of Carlisle.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Kirkby Stephen and the benefice of Mallerstang shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Kirkby Stephen with Mallerstang' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the *London Gazette* the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Henry Walter Mycroft, if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Kirkby Stephen, shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage house.* Upon the Union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Kirkby Stephen shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"4. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the united benefice the patron of the said benefice of Mallerstang shall have the first turn and the patron of the benefice of Kirkby Stephen shall have the second and third turns.

"5. *Clerical and lay assistance.* After the union has taken effect the incumbent of the united benefice shall, in order to assist him in performing the duties of the united benefice, employ a curate or such other

clerical or lay assistance as the Bishop of the diocese shall from time to time direct.

"6. *Diversion of Endowments.* Upon the union taking effect a part of the endowments of the united benefice, namely, a capital sum sufficient to produce an annual payment of £200 being part of a larger capital sum appropriated to the benefice of Kirkby Stephen pursuant to the Tithe Act, 1936, shall be severed and diverted from the said benefice of Kirkby Stephen and from the united benefice and shall be transferred to and held by us, the said Church Commissioners, as part of and for the benefit of our General Fund and in consideration of the said transfer we shall make out of the said General Fund such periodical payments to the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Carlisle as we from time to time determine to be equitable having regard to the value of the said endowments."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the *London Gazette*.
