

Council of the 28th September, 1944, in connection with the re-assessment of certain awards under Orders in Council of the 27th March, 1923, and the 1st February, 1926, shall be withdrawn as far as they relate to any such re-assessed award, or any portion thereof, which is calculated with reference to the degree of disablement of the pensioner.

"SCHEDULE III

"Any general conditions attaching to the grant or continuance of a pension shall also apply to the grant or continuance of any increase to that pension awarded under Schedules I or II hereof."

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 27th day of August, 1952 (C.W. 7231/52) in the words following, viz:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Schedule II of Order in Council dated the 22nd day of January, 1920, the rank of Commander (Warrant, now Branch, Rank) was authorised in certain branches of the Royal Navy:

"And whereas, owing to the limited number of senior Electrical Officers (General List) arising from the recent introduction of the Electrical Branch, we are of the opinion that it is desirable to employ selected senior Branch Officers of the Electrical Branch of the Royal Navy in the equivalent rank of Commander:

"We beg leave humbly that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorise the establishment of the rank of Commander (L) (Branch List) in Your Majesty's Navy, to which selected Lieutenant-Commanders (L) (Branch List) may be promoted, provided they have served in the latter rank for a period corresponding to that which would have qualified them for similar promotion on the General List of the Electrical Branch. Their conditions remaining in all other respects those of Branch Officers.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence to these proposals."

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 25th day of July, 1952, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parish Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a

new parish to be taken out of the parishes of Stockingford and Saint Mary the Virgin, Nuneaton, in the diocese of Coventry.

"SCHEME

"Whereas, we, the Church Commissioners are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the sub-joined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment therefor will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Neville, Bishop of Coventry (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. Constitution:

"(a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a minister the area defined in the sub-joined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint Peter, Galley Common'.

"2. Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery:

"The parish shall be in the archdeaconry of Coventry and in the rural deanery of Atherstone.

"THE SCHEDULE

"The area comprising:—

"All those contiguous parts (together coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parishes of Stockingford and Saint Mary the Virgin, Nuneaton, which are bounded on the north in part by the parish of Hartshill, and in part by the parish of Ansley, on the west also by the parish of Ansley, on the south in part by the parish of Astley and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Astley from parish of Stockingford at the southern end of the wall or fence which divides close numbered 1052 on the map annexed hereto from close numbered 1053 and continuing thence northwards along the walls or fences which divide closes numbered 1052 and 1002 from closes numbered 1053 and 1001 to their end and continuing thence first eastwards and then northwards along the walls or fences which divide close numbered 987 from close numbered 1001 and in the same straight line to a point in the middle of Ansley Road and continuing thence eastwards along the middle of Ansley Road to a point opposite the middle of the southern end of the lane known locally as Ash Lane and continuing thence to and along the middle of Ash Lane first north-westwards and then northwards to a point in the middle of the bridge which carries Ash Lane over Whittleford Brook and continuing thence first eastwards and then north-eastwards along the middle of Whittleford Brook to the boundary which divides the parish of Stockingford from the parish of Saint Mary the Virgin, Nuneaton, and continuing thence generally north-westwards along the last-mentioned boundary to a point 200 feet to the south of the middle of Green Lane and continuing thence north-eastwards along an imaginary line parallel to, and at a distance of 200 feet from, the middle of Green Lane to the southwestern end of the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises on the southeastern side of Greere Lane and continuing thence along the walls or fences at the rear of the houses and premises known as numbers 115 to 11, Green Lane (thereby crossing Ramsden Avenue) and in the same straight line to a point on the wall or fence which divides close numbered 122 from close numbered 123 (thereby crossing close numbered 122) and continuing thence north-westwards along the last-mentioned wall or fence to a point opposite its northwestern end on the boundary which divides the parish of Stockingford from the parish of Saint
