WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 29th day of August, 1952 (C.W. 8298/52), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 28th day of October, 1949, was authorised, inter alia, the ranks and titles of Commissioned Catering Officer and Senior Commissioned Catering Officer in the Royal Navy:

"And whereas we are of the opinion that additional officers of those ranks will be required in time of War or emergency we desire to institute the ranks of Commissioned Catering Officer and Senior Commissioned Catering Officer in the Royal Naval Reserve:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the institution of such ranks in the Royal Naval Reserve and the entry, at our discretion, of such officers thereto under the conditions set forth in the Schedule annexed hereto:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

### 'SCHEDULE Candidates must be between the ages of 28 and 45 and certify their intention to follow the sea as a career; have served for 3 years and within the last six months—as Chief Steward/Purser and Purser/Chief Steward of a British Merchant vessel of 10,000 tons or below, "Conditions of Entry ... ... as Chief Steward of a British Merchant vessel of 10,000 tons or above in which the Victualling Department complement is 75 or more, as Second Steward of a British Merchant vessel of 15,000 tons or above. "Training ... 42 days within first 2 years of entry; 14 days every other year. From Commissioned Catering Officer to Senior Commissioned Catering Officer—by selection from officers with 5-9 years' seniority in the former rank who have completed a minimum of 70 days Naval Training " Promotion in peace-time From Senior Commissioned Catering Officer to Lieutenant (S) (Branch List)—by selection from officers with at least 5 years' seniority in the former rank, who have completed a minimum of 42 days Naval training in that rank and are under the age of 47½. From Commissioned or Senior Commissioned Catering Officer to Lieutenant (S) (General List)—by selection from officers under the age of 36, who have been employed for at least 2 years as Pursers or Assistant Pursers of a British Merchant Vessel and who successfully complete a conversion course. Compulsory retirement at age of 50. Officers will be liable to be placed on the Retired List or removed from the Active List under the conditions applying to the Royal Naval Reserve generally. "Retirement " Pay During full-time service or training will be as for corresponding ranks in the Royal Navy. "Training Fees As for equivalent ranks in other branches of the Royal Naval Reserve." #### PRESENT.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 21st day of August, 1952, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly propose to Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the name of the parish of Saint Stephen, Portland Town, in the diocese of London.

#### " SCHEME.

"Whereas by an Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council dated the 6th November, 1849, and published in the London Gazette on the 13th November, 1849, a particular district was assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Stephen the Martyr, Portland Town, within the parish of Christ Church, Saint Marylebone, situate in the said diocese of London, under the name of 'The Chapelry District of Saint Stephen, Portland Town':

"And whereas the said particular district has

"And whereas the said particular district has since become a parish under the same name:

"And whereas it has been represented to us the said Church Commissioners, and it appears to us that the name of the said parish should be altered as hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend William, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), and with the consent of the parochial church council of the said parish (in testimony whereof this Scheme is signed by the Chairman of and two other members present at a meeting of the same council duly convened for the purpose of giving such consent) humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that as from the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the name of the said parish shall be altered to 'The Parish of Saint John's Wood'."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registerd by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

BURIAL, ENGLAND.

DISCONTINUANCE.

THE BURIAL GROUNDS (WAINFLEET ALL SAINTS) ORDER, 1952.

Made - - 4th September, 1952 At the Court at *Balmoral*, the 4th day of *September*, 1952.

#### PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Minister of Housing and Local Government, after giving 10 days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, did, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853 (16 & 17 Vict. c. 134), as amended by subsequent enactments, make a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that for the protection of the Public Health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of Wainfleet All Saints in the County of Lincoln, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Housing and Local Government, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as hereinafter directed:

And whereas by an Order in Council of the 24th June, 1952, Notice of such Representation was given,

and it was ordered that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 5th day of August next, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. No new burial ground shall be opened in the said Civil Parish of Wainfleet All Saints save with the previous approval of the Minister of Housing and Local Government, and burials shall be discontinued therein as follows, viz.:—

Wainfleet All Saints.—Forthwith and entirely in the old Churchyard of All Saints in the said Parish:
Provided that—

In the said Churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Wainfleet All Saints) Order, 1952.
