The QUEEN has been graciously pleased to approve the award of the British Empire Medal (Military Division) to:—

2495138 Acting Corporal Derek George SHORT, Royal Air Force, Royal Air Force/Royal Canadian Air Force Station, North Luffenham.

At approximately 12.00 hours on 24th June, 1952, a Canadian aircraft (Sabre F.86) landed on the main runway at North Luffenham with a fire in the forward starboard side of the fuselage. The crash crew, with Corporal Short a member of the R.A.F. Station Liaison Party in charge, arrived as the pilot left the cockpit. The pilot warned Corporal Short that the aircraft was carrying ammunition. Immediate action was taken by Corporal Short to extinguish the fire, and shortly after this the ammunition began to explode. One tray was removed but the ammunition continued to explode in the aircraft and also in the removed tray which was then on the ground behind Corporal Short. Despite this, the corporal continued in his effort to extinguish the fire, aided then by the remainder of the crash crew and, after some ten minutes, he succeeded in so doing. By his personal action and example the aircraft was saved from serious damage. Corporal Short's action was extremely meritorious in that, without thought of danger to himself, he carried out his duties and thereby ensured the safety of his fellow airmen whose lives would have been endangered had the aircraft exploded.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

Notification will be sent by post, on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part, and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

Weights for kitchen scales.

Walking sticks and canes wholly of wood except for the ferrules.

The Order also reduces the rate of purchase tax on certain goods, as follows:—

Glassware of cut glass, from 100 per cent. to 66½ per cent.

Pianos and similar musical instruments, from 66½ per cent. to 33½ per cent.

Leather trunks, bags, wallets, jewel cases, pouches, purses, suit cases, attaché cases, etc., from 100 per cent. to 66½ per cent.

The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Special Order No. 141, 1952 (made 12th September, 1952).

1. Declares, as from 16th September, 1952, a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Chislet, Canterbury, Kent, which replaces and contracts the Infected Area around Chilham, Canterbury, Kent, declared by Special Order No. 134, 1952, and contracted by Special Order No. 139, 1952.

2. Releases the Infected Area around Chislet, Canterbury, Kent, from restrictions on 23rd September, 1952.

3. Contracts slightly, as from 16th September, 1952, the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Hamsey, Lewes, Sussex, declared by Special Order No. 133, 1952, and amended by Special Orders (Nos. 135 and 138, 1952).

4.
