" The area comprising:—

" All that part of the parish of Christ Church, Cobridge (shown by the pink colour on the map), which lies generally to the northwest of the territory described in Part I of this Schedule and proposed to be annexed to the parish of Northwood and to the northeast of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Holy Trinity, Sneyd, from the parish of Christ Church, Cobridge, in the middle of an unnamed road leading to Abbey Street and extending thence southeastwards along the middle of the said unnamed road and Abbey Street (thereby crossing Leek New Road) to the southeastern end of Abbey Street and continuing thence first northeastwards and then southeastwards along the track or footpath leading from Abbey Street to Sneyd Street to a point in the middle of Sneyd Street and continuing thence eastwards along the middle of Sneyd Street for a distance of 100 feet or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the track or footpath leading from Sneyd Street to 'the Hollows' and continuing thence first southeastwards and then eastwards along the said track or footpath to the boundary which divides the parish of Christ Church, Cobridge, from the parish of Northwood."

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 3rd day of September, 1952, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Gabriel, Heaton, Newcastle-upon-Tyne; Long Benton; Walker; and Saint Mark, Byker, all in the diocese of Newcastle.

" Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

" And whereas the Right Reverend Noel, Bishop of Newcastle, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme).

" Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the

said parishes of Saint Gabriel, Heaton, Newcastle-upon-Tyne; Long Benton; Walker; and Saint Mark, Byker, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

" THE SCHEDULE.

" PART I.

" The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint Gabriel, Heaton, Newcastle-upon-Tyne:—

" 1. All that part (coloured pink on the map) of the parish of Long Benton which is bounded upon the south partly by the parish of Walker and partly by the parish of Saint Gabriel, Heaton, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, upon the south west by the last mentioned parish and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point in the middle of Etherstone Avenue on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Gabriel, Heaton, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, from the parish of Long Benton and extending thence northeastwards along the middle of Etherstone Avenue to its junction with Coach Lane and continuing thence first south and then north east along the middle of an unnamed road to the old tramway track (or waggon way) and thence southeastwards along the middle of the said tramway track to the middle of the main London to Edinburgh line of British Railways (North Eastern Region) and continuing thence southwestwards along the middle of the said railway to the boundary which divides the parish of Long Benton from the parish of Walker.

" 2. All that part (coloured green on the map) of the parish of Walker which lies to the northwest of the main London to Edinburgh line of British Railways (North Eastern Region).

" 3. All that part (coloured brown on the map) of the parish of Saint Mark, Byker, which lies to the northwest of the main London to Edinburgh line of British Railways (North Eastern Region).

" PART II.

" The territory to be annexed to the parish of Walker:—

" All that part (coloured purple on the map) of the parish of Saint Gabriel, Heaton, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, which lies to the southeast of the main London to Edinburgh line of British Railways (North Eastern Region)."
