EXTINGUISHMENT OF A PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY.

County Borough of West Ham.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Housing and Local Government in exercise of powers conferred by section 23 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1944 as incorporated with the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947, has prepared in draft and proposes to make an Order extinguishing the public rights of way over Amelia Street and part of Oriental Road, West Ham.
