SCHEDULE.

An area of approximately 68 square miles in the County of Lancaster.

Northern Boundary.

From Mitton Green the boundary runs through the village and across the river Ribble at Mitton Bridge. It continues along the west side of Mitton Road to the junction with King Street, Whalley and thence via Portfield Road to Sabden. Here it turns south east to the junction of Padiham Road and Sabden Road and continues via Height Top and Guide Lane to Fencegate.

Eastern Boundary.

From Fencegate the boundary runs in a south-easterly direction along the west side of Greenhead Lane and Bardon Lane to the junction with Windermere Avenue, Burnley. Thence it follows A6114 and A671 to the junction with A646, where it runs south past Townley Colliery, Dyneley Knoll and Easden Wood Colliery to Deerplay Old Toll Bar.

Southern Boundary.

The boundary runs along the north side of the road over Habergham Eaves and along A679 to Hillock Vale, Accrington. Thence it skirts the eastern side of Accrington and crosses the Clifton Junction and Accrington Line railway at the Adelphi Works. Continuing along the road over Rothwell Heights it passes Bedlam, Cross Edge and runs on to the junction with A677 south of Sandybeds. Thence it follows the northern side of A677 to Brown Cow where it turns south along Red Shell Lane to Daisy Green. Continuing in a westerly direction it runs along the north and side of the road through Belthorn and Rann to Guide where it follows B6231 through Lower Darwen, Earcroft and Horden Rake to Feniscowles Station.

Western Boundary.

The boundary runs along the eastern edge of A6062 to the Fielden Arms and thence along Preston Old Road and A674 round the western outskirts of Blackburn to the Yew Tree Inn, Beardwood. Here it turns along Yew Tree Drive, Whinney Lane and Shadley Lane to the junction with Ribchester Road. Thence it continues along the road in a northerly direction to Ribchester Bridge, where it follows the south bank of the River Ribble past Sales Wheel and Dinckley Ferry crossing the river between Raid Deep Wood and the Aqueduct. Thence it follows a stream along the side of Raid Deep Wood to the road at a point a little east of Dilworth House and continues along the road via Lower Hodder Bridge to Mitton Green.

An area of approximately 155 square miles in the County of Lancaster.

Northern Boundary.

From the south side of Church Street, Horwich the boundary runs east along Chorley Old Road to Park Reservoir and along the western edge of the reservoir across a road to the junction of George's Lane and Stone Brow. Thence it runs via Moor Lane, Edge Lane and Scout Road to Horrock's Scout. It continues along the south side of the road through Horrock's Fold, Eagley, Toppings and Bradshaw to Holcombe Brook, thence through Higher and Lower Summerseat to Rowlands.

Eastern Boundary.

The eastern boundary follows Rowlands Road to the junction with Walmersley Road and follows A56 through Bury and Whitefield to the junction with Milton Lane in Prestwich. Following the northern side of Milton Lane the boundary then runs in a south-westerly direction, over the River Irwell at Agecroft Bridge and across the former L.M.S. railway line to the War Memorial at Pendlebury. Continuing due south it follows the western edge of Bolton Road to the junction with the Manchester Road. Thence it continues along the northern side of the Manchester Road across A580 and on via Folly Lane and Rocky Lane across the former Eccles, Tyldesley and Wigan Railway Line and the former L.M.S. railway near Ellesmere Iron Foundry. Continuing south the boundary runs along A575,

across the Manchester Ship Canal at Barton Bridge, through Crofts Bank and thence by B5214 over the former Cheshire Lines Railway. From here it follows B5213 to the former L.N.E. and L.M.S. Junction Railway which it follows in a south-westerly direction to Broadheath Junction.

Southern Boundary.

The boundary follows the northern bank of the railway through Dunham Massey, Warburton, Lymm and Thelwall to the bridge over the Manchester Ship Canal at Latchford Viaduct. Thence it runs along the northern bank of the Manchester Ship Canal to the Chester Road swing bridge.

Western Boundary.

Running north along the eastern edge of Chester Road, Bridge Street and Winnick Road to Winnick the boundary continues to Dolly's Bridge. Thence it follows the south bank of the railway to Kenyon Junction and continues in a northerly direction through Pennington and Atherton Stations to the junction with the Liverpool Manchester Line. From here it follows the railway through Dobb Brow Junction to Horwich Station.
