THE EARL MARSHAL'S NOTICE TO PEERS AND PEERESSES CONCERNING THEIR ATTENDANCE AT THE SOLEMNITY OF THE CORONATION OF HER MOST SACRED MAJESTY QUEEN ELIZABETH II IN WESTMINSTER ABBEY ON JUNE 2ND NEXT.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty having been pleased to command me, as Earl Marshal of England, to prepare and countersign Letters of Summons to be passed under the Royal Sign Manual, requiring the attendance of Peers and Peeresses of Great Britain at the Solemnity of Her Majesty's Royal Coronation, and the Queen having been further pleased to command me to prepare such Letters also for those Peers of Ireland whose right to vote at the election of a Representative Peer for Ireland has, on claim made on their behalf, been admitted by the House of Lords and who are not now Members of the House of Commons, I do hereby request that all those Peers who, in conformity with the above regulations, desire to attend at the Solemnity of the Royal Coronation of Her Majesty, will be pleased to transmit their respective addresses to me at this office; and that the Peeresses who may desire to attend at the said Coronation, will also be pleased to transmit their respective Christian names and addresses to me, in order that their applications may be considered.

Note.—1. Only the applications of those Peers and Peeresses who reply to the above intimation before the 18th day of December will receive consideration. A reasonable margin of time will be allowed in the case of those Peers and Peeresses who are at present residing overseas.

2. Owing to the shortage of space in the Abbey, and the necessity of providing seating for Representatives of the Commonwealth and Empire, the number of Peers and Peeresses who will receive summonses to attend may have to be curtailed.

No guarantee can therefore be given that the receipt of applications as requested above will ensure summonses to attend, and it may be necessary to arrange distribution by ballot or by other similar means.

3. It is regretted that owing to the reasons mentioned in Note 2 above, the Widows of Peers will not receive Her Majesty's Summons upon this occasion, excepting those who are Dames Grand Cross of the Orders of Knighthood.

THE EARL MARSHAL'S ORDERS CONCERNING THE ROBES AND DRESS TO BE WORN BY PEERS AND PEERESSES ATTENDING THE SOLEMNITY OF THE CORONATION OF HER MOST SACRED MAJESTY QUEEN ELIZABETH II IN WESTMINSTER ABBEY.

PEERS

Those Peers taking part in the Processions or Ceremonies in Westminster Abbey will wear Robes of State, with coronets, over full Dress Civil Uniform or No. 1 Full Dress Naval Uniform, Full Dress Military Uniform or Full Dress Royal Air Force Uniform to which they may be entitled or, if not entitled to any uniform, then over full velvet Court Dress, or one of the alternative styles of Court Dress, as laid down in the Regulations for Court Dress in the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Those Peers not taking part in the processions or ceremonies will be expected to wear the same if possible. Alternatively, they may wear mantles of Orders of Knighthood to which they may be entitled, or Parliament Robes, over any dress which they wore at a previous Coronation, or over evening dress (knee breeches optional) or a black suit with white shirt, wing collar, white bow tie and waistcoat (as for evening dress). Peers below the rank of Earl who are not in possession of coronets may wear, as an alternative to coronets, Caps of State of a pattern similar to those worn inside coronets, details of which will be available on application to the Earl Marshal's Office after January 15th.

The Robe of State of a Peer is to be of crimson velvet, edged down the front with miniver pure, with a full cape also of miniver pure with rows or bars of ermine tails (or the like) according to degree:—

A Baron-two rows of ermine tails.

A Viscount-two rows and a half.

An Earl-three rows.

A Marquess-three rows and a half.

A Duke-four rows.

The coronet of a Peer is to be of silver gilt, the cap of crimson velvet turned up with ermine, with a golden tassel on the top, the circlet having on its rim, in the case of:—

A Baron—Six silver balls on the rim of equal size and at equal distances.

A Viscount—Sixteen silver balls on the rim, all of equal size.

An Earl—Eight silver balls, raised on points, with golden strawberry leaves between the points, very slightly raised.

A Marquess—Four golden strawberry leaves and four silver balls alternately, all very slightly raised, and all of equal height.

A Duke—Eight golden strawberry leaves, very slightly raised, and all of equal height.

No jewels or precious stones may adorn the coronets of Peers, nor counterfeit pearls be used instead of silver balls. The circlets of coronets of all degrees are to be chased, or engraved, with representations of jewels, except those of Barons, which are to be plain.

NOTE.

- 1. Decorations and Collars and Stars of Orders of Knighthood will be worn.
- 2. A Peer whose highest dignity is in the Peerage of Scotland or Ireland will wear robes and coronet of such dignity.

PEERESSES.

Peeresses attending will be expected to wear, if possible, Robes of State and coronets, according to their respective ranks, together with Kirtles and Coronation dress.

Those not in possession of the above, and below the degree of Countess, may wear alternative robes and dress, details of which will be available on application to the Earl Marshal's Office after January 15th.

Those not in possession of coronets, and who are below the degree of Countess, may wear alternatively Caps of State of a pattern similar to those worn inside a coronet, exact details of which will also be available after January 15th.

The Robe of State of a Peeress consists of a mantle of crimson velvet with a train, the whole edged with a band of miniver pure and having a cape also of miniver pure with rows or bars of ermine tails (or the like), as follows:—

A Baroness—The train three feet on the ground, the edging of miniver pure to be two inches, and the cape to have two rows of ermine tails.

A Viscountess—The train a yard and a quarter, the edging two inches, and two rows and a half of ermine tails.

A Countess—The train a yard and a half, the edging three inches, and three rows of ermine tails.

A Marchioness—The train a yard and three quarters, the edging four inches, and the cape to have three rows and a half of ermine tails.

A Duchess—The train two yards, the edging to be five inches in breadth, and the cape to have four rows of ermine tails.

The Coronet of a Peeress is to be similar in all respects to that of a Peer of the same degree, except in regard to its size, which is to be smaller.

The Coronation Dress worn by a Peeress with her Robe consists of a Kirtle of crimson velvet, bordered all round with a narrow edging of miniver pure, scalloped or straight in front, or gathered back in three festoons, each tied with a bow of golden tinsel, plain otherwise. The Kirtle, which may be fastened down the back or the front, opens from the waist widening gradually down to the ground. The sleeves should be about nine inches long, and each have two narrow bands of miniver pure, and a like edging which may be scalloped. White lace sleeves may be added.

The Kirtle is worn over the usual full Court Dress, without a train. The petticoat (or skirt) should be white or slightly cream coloured, with lace, embroidery, or brocade, in accordance with taste. Brocade is to be of gold or silver; no colour may be introduced into it. Feathers and veils will not be worn but a tiara should be worn, if possible.

Note.

- 1. Jewels may be worn round the neck, on the bodice, and on the petticoat.
- 2. Any Robes and Kirtles worn at previous Coronations may be worn.
- 3. The wives of Peers, and Peeresses in their own right whose highest dignity is in the Peerage of Scotland or Ireland, will wear robes of such dignity.

THE EARL MARSHAL'S DRESS REGULATIONS (For others than Peers and Peeresses.)

GENTLEMEN.

Those taking part in the Procession inside Westminster Abbey will wear Full Dress Uniform (Naval, Military, Royal Air Force or Civil), or one of the forms of Court Dress as laid down in the Lord Chamberlain's Regulations for Dress at Court.

Knights Grand Cross, Knights Grand Commanders and Officers of the Orders of Knighthood, except those attending in another capacity will wear the mantles of their Orders; the Kings of Arms of the Orders will require their Crowns.

Those attending the service inside the Abbey but not taking part in the inside Procession will be dressed as follows:—

CIVILIANS. One of the forms of Court Dress as laid down in the Lord Chamberlain's Regulations for Dress at Court, or evening dress with knee breeches or trousers, or morning dress, or dark lounge suits

OFFICERS IN THE CIVIL SERVICE. Full dress or Levee Dress coats with white knee breeches and white silk stockings or trousers, or evening dress with knee breeches or trousers.

OFFICERS IN THE FOREIGN SERVICE, Full dress or Levee Dress coats with white knee breeches or trousers, or evening dress with knee breeches or trousers, or white tropical uniform.

OFFICERS IN THE COLONIAL SERVICE. Full dress or Levee Dress coats with white knee breeches and white silk stockings or trousers, evening dress with knee breeches or trousers, or white tropical uniform.

OFFICERS IN THE SERVICES.

- (a) Naval Officers. Blue Ceremonial Dress (No. 3 Dress—undress Coat).
- (b) Army Officers. Full Dress Uniform or No. 1 Dress Ceremonial, or No. 1 Dress (Blues).
- (c) Royal Air Force Officers. No. 1 (Home) Dress with sword and embellishments.

LADIES.

Evening dresses or afternoon dresses, with a light veiling falling from the back of the head. (Full details will be obtainable from the Earl Marshal's Office after 15th January.)

No hats or coats may be worn but a light wrap may be worn.

Dames Grand Cross will wear the Mantles of their Orders.

Tiaras may be worn.

GENERAL NOTE.

Oriental Dress may be worn by Ladies and Gentlemen for whom it is the usual Ceremonial Costume.

Orders and Decorations to be worn in full, except with Court Dress or Evening Dress with which miniatures will be worn.

Collar Day.

No one may attend in mourning.

The QUEEN has been graciously pleased to approve the following immediate award in recognition of gallant and distinguished service in Korea.

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Flight Lieutenant Edgar Wesley Guy (033133), Royal Australian Air Force, No. 77 (Interceptor/Fighter) Squadron.

Flight Lieutenant Guy was a member of No. 77 (Interceptor/Fighter) Squadron, Royal Australian Air Force, Korea, from February, 1952, until August, 1952, and over the last three months of this period held the appointment of Flight Commander. On 27th August, 1952, Flight Lieutenant Guy led the Squadron in a rocket attack against an enemy Divisional Headquarters in North Korea. The target, located in most difficult terrain was heavily defended. Divisional Headquarters in North Korea. The target, located in most difficult terrain, was heavily defended, and visibility was reduced to a minimum due to adverse weather. By his daring and brilliant leadership, Flight Lieutenant Guy located the position, led the Squadron into attack, and completely destroyed the target. During his operational tour, Flight Lieutenant Guy carried out 174 individual sorties, all of which were flown in Meteor Jet Fighter Aircraft against the enemy, including 80 strike attacks against defended enemy installations, troop and supply areas and lines of communication. He personally led the Squadron on many of those attacks. Throughout his entire operational tour, Flight Lieutenant Guy consistently displayed personal courage, leadership and ability of a very high order, bringing great credit upon himself and the Royal Australian Air Force.

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF PLANS ASSISTANTS IN H.M. LAND REGISTRY.

1. Age.

Candidates must be at least 16 and under 18 years

of age on 1st March, 1953.

But candidates who have served in any established post to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, or who have served on established conditions except for sick leave and pension in a post to which such a certificate would normally apply, may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service before 1st March, 1953, provided that the maximum of two years may be extended by any period of compulsory service in H.M. Forces under the National Service Acts.

Both boys and girls are eligible.

3. Nationality.

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or
(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.
(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight

Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph, they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or resi-

dence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

5. Examination.

The subjects of examination and the marks they will carry are as follows:-

(1) English ... (2) Arithmetic ... (3) Mathematics ... 100 200 ---(4) Drawing 200

Candidates will be arranged in order of merit according to their aggregate of marks in the examina-tion as a whole. Even if there are unfilled vacancies, no candidate will be appointed who does not attain an aggregate which satisfies the Civil Service Commissioners.
