At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 4th day of December, 1952.

PRESENT.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 2nd day of December, 1952 (C.W. 5846/51), in the words following, viz.:

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Forces to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein,

or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the 15th day of March, 1951, certain rates of pay were sanctioned, inter alia, for Dental Officers of Your Majesty's Navy:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the 29th day of April, 1949, revised conditions of service and promotion were sanctioned, inter alia, for Dental Officers of Your Majesty's Navy:

"And whereas we are of the opinion that the duties of the Senior Dental Officer of Your Majesty's Navy have increased in scope as to justify the officer so appointed being granted the rank of Surgeon Rear Admiral (Dental):

admiral (Dental):

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the institution, with effect from the 1st day of October, 1952, of the rank of Surgeon Rear Admiral (Dental) in Your Majesty's Navy,

under the following conditions:—
"Compulsory retirement—on ceasing to hold the appointment or on attaining the age of 60 if not

superseded before.

"Full Pay and Allowances—as for Rear Admiral.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

Her Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PRESENT.

The OUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the first day of October, 1952, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the benefice of Chichester, Saint Olave with Saint Martin, the benefice of Chichester Saint Andrew the benefice benefice of Chichester, Saint Olave with Saint Martin, the benefice of Chichester, Saint Andrew, the benefice of Chichester, Saint Peter the Great, the benefice of Chichester, Saint Peter the Less, and the benefice of Chichester, All Saints, all situate in the diocese of Chichester, and for effecting an alteration in the boundaries of the parishes of some of the said benefices and of the benefices of Chichester, Saint Bartholomew; Chichester, Saint Paul; Chichester, Saint Pancras; Rumboldswyke and Portfield.

"SCHEME.

- "1. Union of Benefices and Parishes. The said benefice of Chichester, Saint Olave with Saint Martin, the said benefice of Chichester, Saint Peter the Great, the said benefice of Chichester, Saint Peter the Less, and the said benefice of Chichester, All Saints, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Chichester, Saint Peter the Great' and the parishes of the said benefices shall, subject as hereinafter provided, also be united into one parish for ecclesiastical purposes (the area of which is shown coloured purple on the map annexed hereto). hereto).
- "2. Taking effect of union. Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Charles Godfrey Platt Wells if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Chichester, Saint Peter the Great, shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto) be the first incumbent of the united benefice.
- "3. Parish Church. The parish church of the parish of Saint Peter the Great, Chichester, shall be the parish church of the united parish.
- "4. Appropriation of Saint Andrew's Church, Chichester. After the union has taken effect the church of Saint Andrew, Chichester, shall, subject to the provisions of the said Measures, be appropriated for any educational or charitable purpose or purposes in connection with the Church of England having in view the spiritual, intellectual,
