Whitehall, Dec. 5. An Express arrived here yesterday in the Aiternoon from Sir Cloudelly Shovell, on board Her Majelty's Ship the Triumph, with an Account. That he failed from the Dinnes the 24th of the last Month, with the Squadron under his Com-mand, for the River, and Anchored that evening off the Long Sand lead, about 6 Leagues S. W. of the Northfereland. Her Majelty Ships the Triumpo, St. George, Reyal Oak, and Cambridge, rid out the Storm, fince which they got in near the Gunfleet, where the Express left them; But the rest of the Squadron, viz. the Afficciation, Ruffel, Revenge, and Dorfeesbire, wete forced from their Anchors, and drove off to Sea. Letters from Cartain Trevor Commander of Her Majetty's Ship the Triton, which was fent out from Terments in fearch of these Ships, dated off Dunwich the 4th Instant, give an Account, That on the 3d, about two in the afternoon, he spoke with the Revenge, Captain Kerr Commander, who informed him, That being drove from their Anchors the 27th past, they came over the North-end of the Galloper, and afterwards faw the Ruffel and Dorferfibire; the former of which left them the 29th, intending for the Downes, and the Revenge bore up for Helvoerssus; bat it falling little Wind, they halled off, and stood to the Northward, and in the aftermon faw the Aff ciarion. When the Letters came away the Revenge was off Dunwich, intending for -Oolly or Advicagh Bay.
