The QUEEN has been graciously pleased to approve the award of the George Medal in recognition of gallant and distinguished services in Korea, to the undermentioned:—

Lieutenant Beverley Anthony Foster MAWSON (377201), Royal Regiment of Artillery.

Lieutenant MAWSON was Gun Position Officer of "G" Troop 61 Light Regiment which on the night 14th/15th September, 1952, was engaged in an intensive counter mortar programme.

During the programme there was a serious premature in No. 2 mortar as a result of which three men were killed and a fourth was badly wounded. Lieutenant MAWSON who happened to be visiting the detachment at the time was also seriously wounded.

Almost immediately a fire broke out in the pit in which there were about 100 live 4.2 inch mortar bombs. Despite his wounds, Lieutenant MAWSON immediately took charge. He directed operations to extinguish the fire with exemplary coolness and finally succeeded in so doing. This action undoubtedly prevented a large explosion which would have resulted in further casualties and loss of equipment.

Lieutenant MAWSON then organised first aid for the wounded and succour for the dying. Finally he arranged for evacuation of the wounded. At this stage he was weak with loss of blood but still refused to have his own wounds dressed until he had arranged for the programme to resume immediately and had satisfied himself that his Troop Leader, a young National Service Officer, was fully in the picture and so able to direct the rest of the programme.

His coolness in extinguishing the fire was in itself exemplary. The subsequent display of self sacrifice and devotion to duty while getting weaker through loss of blood was of a very high order. The standard of leadership and courage shown by this officer during a very difficult and dangerous incident was quite outstanding.

No. 22246864 Corporal (acting) Colin Leyshon LOWES, Royal Army Medical Corps.

On 12th October, 1952, a line party from "D" Troop was ordered out to lay a telephone line to a forward position.

Bombardier Jones, the N.C.O. in charge inadvertently entered a minefield. He set off a mine and was seriously wounded. One of the signallers went back to the Troop position to fetch Corporal LOWES, the Medical N.C.O., to give first aid.

Corporal LOWES realised what had happened and although fully appreciating the risk of himself

setting off another mine, he, without hesitation, entered the area and traversed a distance of about twenty yards of "live" mines to attend the wounded man.

He ordered the signallers not to enter the area and sent them to a nearby Regimental Aid Post to collect a stretcher bearer party and guide it back to the minefield.

Having done all he possibly could for the wounded N.C.O., pending the arrival of the stretcher, he carefully retraced his steps to the minefield boundary to mark a safe route for the party. Once again he had to pass through twenty yards of "live" mines.

As a result of this careful direction and leadership the severely wounded N.C.O. was speedily evacuated.

The action of Corporal LOWES in deliberately entering a minefield to succour a wounded comrade was a demonstration of cold, calculated courage of the highest order as he was fully aware of the gravity of his act and realised only too clearly that he may well have suffered a similar, if not worse fate than the man he was attempting to save.

This is not an isolated incident for on the 16th September, 1952, he attended the wounds of a man lying in an exposed position while the "D" Troop area was being shelled, and undoubtedly on that occasion contributed greatly to the speedy removal of a badly wounded man.

Throughout Corporal LOWES's attachment to the 61 Light Regiment, Royal Regiment of Artillery, he has reflected the greatest credit on himself and the Corps which he so ably represents.

RECRUITMENT TO BASIC GRADES OF QUANTITY SURVEYORS.

1. *Age.*

Candidates must be at least 25 and under 35 years of age on 1st January, 1953. But

(1) a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may deduct the period of such service from his actual age. (Service in H.M. Forces on a Duration of Emergency engagement or under the National Service Acts cannot be reckoned for this purpose);

(2) candidates who have served in any established post to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, or who have served on established conditions except for sick leave and pension in a post to which such a certificate would normally apply, may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they have spent in such service before 1st January, 1953.

2. *Sex and Marriage.*

(i) Both men and women may compete under these Regulations, except that women will not be eligible for appointments under the Admiralty, Air Ministry and War Office.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid. Provided that this undertaking will not be required if the break between the first period of service (including any period of unestablished service immediately following the period in respect of which the gratuity was paid) and the date of re-establishment is more than seven years.

3. *Nationality.*

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is, or was at death, a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

Provided that a candidate will not be eligible for an appointment under the Admiralty, War Office, or Air Ministry, unless he or she is a natural-born British subject and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions of parents also born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions, except when the circumstances are such as to justify a departure from the general rule, in which case, provided the candidate satisfies the conditions prescribed by the preceding paragraphs, he or she may be admitted to appointment or competition by special permission of the First Lord of the Admiralty, Secretary of State for War, or Secretary of State for Air, as the case may be.

4. *Qualification.*

At the time of application candidates must either

(a) be Corporate Members of the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors (Quantities Section) or

(b) have passed a degree or other examinations necessary for obtaining Corporate Membership.

Candidates admitted under (b) will not have their appointments confirmed unless they obtain Corporate Membership as defined in (a) above within their probation period.

(ii) Maintenance Surveyors.

(c) have passed a degree or other examinations necessary for obtaining Corporate Membership.

Candidates admitted under (c) will not have their appointments confirmed unless they obtain Corporate Membership as defined in (b) above within their probation period.

(iii) Exceptionally where a candidate is prevented by circumstances outside his control from obtaining Corporate Membership within this period, the appointment may be confirmed, with the concurrence

of the Treasury and the Civil Service Commissioners, provided that there is satisfactory evidence that the qualification is likely to be obtained within a reasonable time.

(iv) All candidates will be expected to possess wide professional experience in private or outside practice or in the service of a Local Authority or Government Department. For the post of Architect in the Prison Commission experience of Hospital and Institution work is desirable.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

9. Assignment.

The Commissioners will decide to which Department each successful candidate is to be assigned. Assignment will be made in accordance with the needs of the public service but the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be respected.

10. Canvassing.

1. (i) Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid.

Provided that this undertaking will not be required if the break between the first period of service (including any period of unestablished service immediately following the period in respect of which the gratuity was paid) and the date of re-establishment is more than seven years.

2. Candidates should normally be at least 25 years of age on the 1st March, 1953. But candidates at least 21 and under 25 years of age on that date may be admitted at the discretion of the Civil Service Commissioners if they have exceptionally suitable qualifications.

The Commissioners have not specified an upper age limit. In general, however, Government Departments require a reasonable period of service from persons newly appointed to the Civil Service; and accordingly the Commissioners reserve the right to give weight to this factor in considering for these posts candidates who are over 50 years of age.

3. Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing, or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received such systematic education and have gained such experience as fits them for the post. A University education and a knowledge of economics are desirable. Experience of public speaking, supervision of office procedure, and organisation of work with the public, will be an advantage.

5. Those candidates who appear from their application forms to have the best qualifications will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will recommend to the Commissioners for appointment the candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications. The decision of the Commissioners will be final. The Selection Board will take into consideration a candidate's record of experience and education, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview; and on their estimation of the above evidence they will frame their decision.

6. Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

7. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

8. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons (except as referees to be named by them in their application form) will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work.

9. A successful candidate will be required to pay a fee of £3 before the issue of a certificate of qualification for appointment.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

These Regulations amend the National Insurance (Contributions) Regulations, 1948, so as to secure that a person shall not be entitled to be excepted from liability for, and to be credited with, contributions for a period in respect of which he is unable to satisfy any additional conditions for the receipt of unemployment benefit or sickness benefit imposed in his case by regulations, other than the National Insurance (Married Women) Regulations, 1948, made under sub-section (4) of section 13 of the National Insurance Act, 1946. The existing provision that a person shall not be entitled to be excepted from liability for, and credited with, contributions for a period for which he is disqualified for receiving unemployment or sickness benefit by reason of sub-sections (1), (2) and (3) of section 13 and regulations made thereunder remains unchanged.
