1. Age.

In accordance with Section 77 of the National Insurance Act, 1946, the National Insurance Advisory Committee give notice that they have received from the Minister of National Insurance for consideration and report thereon the preliminary draft of regulations entitled National Insurance (Married Women) Amendment Regulations, 1953.

A short explanatory note on these regulations is appended to this notice.

Having regard to the terms of the Act, which provides that objections must be made within a period of 28 days at most, the Committee are unable to allow a longer period within which objections may be submitted. If an objection is submitted within the prescribed time, however, the Committee will be prepared, if they are satisfied that sufficient grounds exist, to allow the later submission of evidence or explanation in support of the objection. EXPLANATORY NOTE.

These Regulations revoke provisions of the National Insurance (Married Women) Regulations, 1948, which limit the contributions under the National Insurance Act, 1946, to be taken into account for the purpose of determining the right of a married woman to unemployment or sickness

benefit. They also, in certain circumstances and for certain purposes (including the increase of the weekly rate of a retirement pension), enable the payment, by a married woman who is a self-employed person, of contributions as if she were a non-employed person to have effect as if they were contributions as a self-employed person; they simplify the provisions governing the making of certain elections under those Regulations; and they limit the effect of provisions of those Regulations which restrict the right of a married woman to pay contributions as, or as if she were, a non-employed person in certain cases. The remaining provisions of these Regulations are of a minor or consequential character.
