### Civil Service Commission, 1st May, 1953.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz.:—

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF ASSISTANT KEEPER IN THE PUBLIC RECORD OFFICE.

##### 1. Age.

Candidates must be at least 22 and under 26 years of age on 1st January, 1953. But

(a) a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may deduct the period of such service from his actual age;

(b) a candidate who has served in H.M. Forces otherwise than on a regular engagement may deduct the period of such service from his actual age, up to a maximum of two years.

##### 2. Sex and Marriage.

(i) Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid.

##### 3. Nationality.

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is, or was at death, a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph, they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

##### 4. Qualification.

Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received such systematic education and possess in particular such knowledge of Latin and French as to fit them for the post. Candidates must normally have a University degree with First or Second Class Honours in Classics, Law, or History; candidates exceptionally well qualified academically in ways other than the above, provided that they have requisite knowledge of Latin and French, and candidates graduating in Summer, 1953, may be considered.

##### 5. Health and Character.

The successful candidates must satisfy the Commissioners as to health and character.

##### 6. Competition.

Candidates who appear from their applications and the results of any necessary enquiries to have the best qualifications and experience will be summoned for interview in London before a Selection Board which will recommend to the Civil Service Commissioners the candidate considered best fitted for appointment. The Commissioners' decision will be final.

##### 7. Candidates trained as Teachers.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate central education authority (e.g., the Ministry of Education, the Scottish Education Department, the Ministry of Education for Northern Ireland) has been notified to the Commissioners.

##### 8. Canvassing.

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons, except as referees to be named by them in their application forms, will disqualify them for appointment.

##### 9. Fee.

A successful candidate will be required to pay a fee of £4 before the issue of a certificate of qualification for appointment.

## MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT.

### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1947.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 49 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947, authorising the stopping up of a length of Garrick Place, Kidderminster, in the County of Worcester.
