UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT, 1923.

Two Statutes made by the University of Oxford on the 5th May, 1953, have been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

The QUEEN has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that Ulick Browne, Esquire, late Captain in the Royal Regiment of Artillery, Sheelah Annette, wife of John Dalrymple Winn Treherne, and Noreen, widow of Clive Ali Chimmo Branson, shall henceforth have, hold and enjoy, the title, rank, place, pre-eminence and precedence as the son and daughters of a Marquess which would have been due to them had their father, Alfred Eden Browne, Esquire (commonly called Lord Alfred Eden Browne) Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Lieutenant-Colonel in the Army, survived his brother, Terence Morris, Marquess of Sligo, and thereby succeeded to the said title and dignity of Marquess of Sligo.

And to Command that the said Royal Concession and Declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms.
