

**ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930. SECTION 46 (1).
ROAD AND RAIL TRAFFIC ACT, 1933—SECTION 29 (4).**

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 12th day of June, 1953, the Minister of Transport confirmed the County Borough of Bournemouth (Roads Restriction) Order, 1949.

The effect of the Order, which re-enacts certain restrictions imposed by an Order made by the Minister of Transport on the 18th day of June, 1925, under section 7 (4) of the Roads Act, 1920, and by subsequent Amendment Orders (and which may be inspected at the office of the undersigned), is to prohibit (with certain exceptions) the driving on Millhams Road from its junction with Wimborne Road (Route A.341) to its junction with Ringwood Road (Route A.348) of any locomotive, motor tractor, or heavy motor car, or any motor car with seats for more than twenty persons exclusive of the driver.

WESTMORLAND (PENNINE WAY) PUBLIC PATH ORDER,
1953.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 13th day of June, 1953, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to create a public right of way on foot from stepping stones where the path from Dufton to Dun Fell crosses Swindale Beck, thence by way of Knock Fell to Knock Ore Gill, and from Dun Fell Mine by way of Great Dun Fell and Little Dun Fell to the county boundary at Crowdundle Head.

A certified copy of the Order and of the Map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the County Hall, Kendal, and at the office of the Clerk of the North Westmorland Rural District Council, Kirkby Stephen, and will be open for inspection, free of charge, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on every weekday except Saturday, and between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12 noon on every Saturday.

The Order becomes operative as from the 30th day of June, 1953, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provisions contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.
