Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Worcester.

FACTORIES ACTS, 1937 AND 1948.

The Minister of Labour and National Service hereby gives notice that on the 1st October, 1953, he made the Iron and Steel Foundries Regulations, 1953, under sections 46 and 60 of the Factories Act, 1937, and section 8 of the Factories Act, 1948.
