On 2nd February, 1953, when a United States Air Force aircraft crashed and burst into flames, Warrant Officer Currier was one of the first to reach the scene of the accident. Regardless of his own safety, he seized the first available hose and, despite the intense heat, approached and remained close enough to the furiously burning aircraft to direct a constant jet on to and through the main door to help to keep the flames back from the only exit for the passengers. By his prompt and deliberate actions, Warrant Officer Currier showed considerable personal bravery and inspired others to assist him in fighting the fire. He was later admitted to hospital for minor burns. Warrant Officer Currier set a fine example and Warrant Officer Currier set a fine example and it was largely due to his courage and promptitude that all twenty-two passengers escaped from the burning aircraft with their lives.
