Whereas by Section 65 of the Merchant Shipping (Safety and Load Line Conventions) Act, 1932 (22 & 23 Geo. 5. c. 9), it is enacted that Her Majesty, if satisfied that the government of any country has acceded to the Load Line Convention, may, by Order in Council. make a declaration to that effect:

And whereas Her Majesty is satisfied that the Government of the Republic of Costa Rica has acceded to the Load Line Convention:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in pursuance of the powers vested in Her by the aforesaid Section and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and doth hereby order as follows:

1. It is hereby declared that the Government of the Republic of Costa Rica has acceded to the Load Line Convention.
