PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas by Section 65 of the Merchant Shipping
(Safety and Load Line Conventions) Act, 1932 (22 &
23 Geo. 5. c. 9), it is enacted that Her Majesty, if
satisfied that the government of any country has
acceded to the Load Line Convention, may, by Order
in Council, make a declaration to that effect:

And whereas Her Majesty is satisfied that the
Government of the Republic of Costa Rica has
acceded to the Load Line Convention:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in pursuance of the
powers vested in Her by the aforesaid Section and of
all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, by
and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased
to order and doth hereby order as follows:—

1. It is hereby declared that the Government of
the Republic of Costa Rica has acceded to the Load
Line Convention.

2. This Order may be cited as the Merchant
Shipping (Load Line Convention) (Costa Rica) Order,
1953, and shall come into operation upon the date
of its publication in the London Gazette.

(Safety Convention) Act, 1949 (12, 13 & 14 Geo. 6.

c. 43), it is enacted that Her Majesty, if satisfied
that the government of any country has accepted
the Safety Convention or that the Safety Convention
extends to any territory, may, by Order in Council,
make a declaration to that effect:

And whereas Her Majesty is satisfied that the
Government of the Republic of Chile has accepted
the Safety Convention:

And whereas Her Majesty is satisfied that the
Safety Convention extends to the territories specified
in the Schedule to this Order:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in pursuance of the
powers vested in Her by the aforesaid Section and of
all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, by
and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased
to order and doth hereby order as follows:—

1. It is hereby declared that the Government of
the Republic of Chile has accepted the Safety
Convention.

2. It is hereby declared that the Safety Convention
extends to the territories specified in the Schedule to
this Order.

3. This Order may be cited as the Merchant
Shipping (Safety Convention Countries) (Various)
(No. 2) Order, 1953, and shall come into operation
upon the date of its publication in the London
Gazette.
