The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made two Orders under Section 19 of the Import Duties Act 1932, Sections 9 and 14 of the Finance Act, 1933, Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1934, Section 4 of the Finance Act, 1937, and Section 1 of the Import Duties (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1939 viz:—

The Import Duties (Exemptions) (No. 4) Order, 1953, which provides that (with certain exceptions) imported books, publications and other documents, paintings and drawings, etchings and engravings, hand-etched blocks etc., and sculptures, shall be exempt from the duty otherwise payable thereon under the Import Duties Act, 1932. The Order is substantially a re-enactment in consolidated form of pre-existing exemptions, but some of these earlier exemptions have been extended in order to give effect to the U.N.E.S.C.O. Agreement on the Importation of Educational, Scientific and Cultural Materials, signed at Lake Success on 22nd November, 1950.

The Order also provides that the Victoria and Albert Museum (in lieu of the Tate Gallery) shall in future issue the certificates which are required before etchings and engravings, and the blocks etc. from which they are printed, can be admitted under this exemption

and

The Silk Duties (No. 1) Order, 1953, which is also made to give effect to the U.N.E.S.C.O. Agreement, provides that books, publications and other documents, paintings and drawings, and etchings and engravings, shall not be chargeable with silk or artificial silk duties by reason of any silk or artificial silk which may be contained therein.

The Orders come into operation on the 14th December, 1953, and will be published as Statutory Instruments 1953, Nos. 1637 and 1638.

The QUEEN has been pleased to award the Edward Medal to the late Thomas Dalziel Bennie in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:—

As the result of a fall of roof in Fauldhead Colliery, Dumfriesshire, on 22nd May, 1953, a miner was trapped by a large stone, but the dirt in the sides of the road prevented the full weight of the stone bearing on him. The fall displaced timber supports and left the roof in a dangerous condition, with every indication of further collapse. Despite the risk, Bennie, who had been working with the trapped miner, remained in order to try to release him, but a further fall occurred and Bennie was fatally injured. His disregard of personal risk in his attempts to rescue the trapped miner was in the highest tradition of the mining industry.

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF MUSEUM ASSISTANTS IN THE SCIENCE MUSEUM UNDER THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION.

1. (i) Both men and women may compete under these regulations but the number of vacancies available for women may be restricted.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total mental or physical incapacity) will not be eligible for appointment unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid. Provided that this undertaking will not be required if the break between the first period of service (including any period of unestablished service immediately following the period in respect of which the gratuity was paid) and the date of re-establishment is more than seven years.

2. *Age.*

Candidates must be at least 16 years of age on 1st September, 1953. The Commissioners have not specified an upper age limit for this competition. (e) have passed in all cases with a pass in mathematics or a science subject or in a modern foreign language, as appropriate

- (i) the Forces Preliminary Examination, or
- (ii) the Royal Air Force Higher Education Test, Part I, or
- (iii) the Admiralty Higher Educational Test, Second Class;

or

(f) have passed an examination accepted by the Commissioners as of an academic standard, at least as high as those named above.

Exceptionally, the above requirements may be waived for candidates with experience of special value to the Museum.

5. Experience.
