The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Her Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Her by section five of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1885 (48 & 49 Vict. c. 42), and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The total number of boys and girls being educated and maintained under section five of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1872 (35 & 36 Vict. c. 67), at any one time shall not exceed one hundred and fifty.

2. The Order in Council made the twelfth day of December, 1885 (Rev. XXV, p. 326), under the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1885, is hereby revoked.

3. This Order may be cited as the Greenwich Hospital (Education and Maintenance of Children) Order, 1953, and shall come into operation on the twenty-first day of November, 1953.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 23rd day of October, 1953, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parishes of Edlington, Warmsworth and Conisbrough in the diocese of Sheffield and for altering the boundaries of the parish of Edlington and the parish of Conisbrough.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas, we, the Church Commissioners are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in Part I of the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish and that it is desirable that the boundaries of the parish of Edlington and the parish of Conisbrough should be altered in the manner described in Part II of the said Schedule:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment for the area to be constituted a new parish will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area described in Part I of the said Schedule as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Leslie, Bishop of Sheffield, (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. (a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a minister, the area defined in Part I of the said Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint John the Baptist, New Edlington'.

"(d) The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Doncaster and in the rural deanery of Doncaster.

"2. As from the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme the boundaries of

the said parish of Edlington and of the said parish of Conisbrough shall be altered in the manner described in Part II of the said Schedule and as delineated on the map hereto annexed.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"Part I.

"The area comprising:—

"All those contiguous parts (coloured pink, green and brown respectively on the map annexed hereto) of the parishes of Edlington, Warmsworth and Conisbrough, which taken together are bounded upon part of the west by the parish of Conisbrough and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Conisbrough from the parish of Edlington at a point in the middle of the Dearne Valley Branch Line of British Railways (Eastern Region) and proceeding thence northeastwards along the middle of the said Branch Line to the middle of the former Hull and Barnsley and Great Central Railway's Joint Committee Branch Line of British Railways (Eastern Region) and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned Branch Line to the middle of Lords Head Lane and continuing thence southeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned Lane to the middle of Broomhouse Lane and continuing thence southwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned Lane to a point opposite the middle of the unnamed road forming Close numbered 122 on the map and continuing thence southeastwards first to and then along the middle of the last mentioned road to a point opposite the northeastern end of the wall or fence forming the northwestern boundary of Close numbered 91 and continuing thence southwestwards and southwards first to and then along the last mentioned wall or fence to the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of Close numbered 85 and continuing thence westwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to the northern end of the eastern boundary of Close numbered 86 and continuing thence southwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to its southern end and continuing thence westwards along the walls or fences forming the southern boundaries of Closes numbered 86 and 87 to their end and continuing thence westwards in the same straight line to a point in the middle of Edlington Lane thereby crossing Close numbered 80 and continuing thence southwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned Lane to a point opposite to the middle of Howbecks Dyke and continuing thence westwards to and northwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned dyke to a point opposite to the wall or fence forming the eastern end of the northern boundary of Close numbered 98 and continuing thence westwards first to and then along the last mentioned wall or fence to the boundary which divides the parish of Edlington from the parish of Conisbrough.

"Part II.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Conisbrough:—

"All that part of the parish of Edlington (coloured blue on the map annexed hereto) lying to the north of the Dearne Valley Branch Line of British Railways (Eastern Region)."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Sheffield.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Bracknell, Binfield, Easthampstead, Warfield and Winkfield, all in the diocese of Oxford.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Kenneth, Bishop of Oxford, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Bracknell, Binfield, Easthampstead, Warfield and Winkfield shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"A. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Bracknell:—

"(a) All that part of the parish of Easthampstead (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) which lies to the north of the middle of the railway line of the Staines and Wokingham Branch of British Railways (Southern Region) and to the north-east of an imaginary line commencing at a point in the middle of the last mentioned railway line at Amen Corner Crossing and continuing thence northwestwards along the middle of the unnamed lane leading from Peacock Lane to Amen Corner (thereby crossing the railway line at Amen Corner Crossing) for a distance of 2½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the parish of Easthampstead from the parish of Binfield.

"(b) All that part of the parish of Binfield (coloured green on the map) which is bounded on the east by the parish of Warfield, on the southeast by the parish of Easthampstead and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Easthampstead from the parish of Binfield opposite the southeastern end of the walls or fences forming the southwestern boundaries of closes numbered 410 and 405 (on the map) and continuing thence northwestwards to and along the last mentioned boundaries (thereby following the wall or fence which divides close number 405 from close number 406) to their end and continuing thence northeastwards along the wall or fence which divides close number 405 from close number 392 to its end and continuing thence northwestwards along the wall or fence which divides close number 392 from closes numbered 394a, 395 and 393 to its end and continuing thence northeastwards along the walls or fences which form the northwestern boundaries of closes numbered 393, 395, 395a, 390 and 389 to a point opposite the northeastern end of the said boundary of the last mentioned close in the middle of the Wokingham to Staines Road and continuing thence northwestwards along the middle of the Wokingham to Staines Road to a point in the middle of Jock's Lane and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of Jock's Lane to its end and in a straight line to the point where the wall or fence which divides close number 327 from close number 347 meets the wall or fence which divides close number 347 from close number 326 and continuing thence first northeastwards then northwestwards along the wall or fence which divides close number 327 from close number 326 to a point opposite its northwestern end in the middle of the stream which forms close number 318 and continuing thence generally northeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned stream to a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Warfield from the parish of Binfield.

"(c) All that part of the parish of Warfield (coloured yellow on the map) which lies to the south of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Binfield from the parish of Warfield in the middle of the stream which forms close number 558 and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned stream to a point opposite the northwestern end of the wall or fence which divides close number 571 from close number 577 and continuing

thence southeastwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence and then southeastwards along the wall or fence which divides close number 571 from close number 572 to a point opposite its southeastern end in the middle of the lane which forms close number 570 and continuing thence northwards along the middle of the last mentioned lane for a distance of $\frac{1}{2}$ chain or thereabouts to a point opposite the western end of the wall or fence which divides close number 569 from close number 564 and continuing thence eastwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence which divides close number 569 from close number 564b to its end and continuing thence northwards along the wall or fence which divides closes numbered 564b and 564 from close number 568 to its end and continuing thence first northeastwards then southeastwards along the wall or fence which divides close number 568 from closes numbered 565 and 566 to a point opposite its southeastern end in the middle of Quelm Lane and continuing thence southeastwards along the middle of Quelm Lane for a distance of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite the western end of the wall or fence which divides close number 623 from close number 621a and continuing thence eastwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence which divides close number 623 from close number 621 to the wall or fence which divides close number 622 from close number 623 and continuing thence generally northeastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the walls or fences which divide closes numbered 622 and 622a from closes numbered 624 and 652 to a point opposite their eastern end in the middle of the road which leads northwestwards from Wick Hill past Warfield Cottage and continuing thence northwards along the last mentioned road for a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite the southwestern end of the wall or fence which divides close number 651 from close number 655 and continuing thence first northeastwards to and along and then northwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to the wall or fence which divides close number 650 from close number 655 and continuing thence eastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence to a point opposite its eastern end in the middle of Priory Road and continuing thence southwestwards along the middle of Priory Road to the boundary which divides the parish of Bracknell from the parish of Warfield.

“B. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Winkfield:—

“All that part of the parish of Bracknell which lies to the northeast of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Warfield from the parish of Bracknell in the middle of Bull Brook and continuing thence generally south-westwards along the middle of Bull Brook to a point opposite the western end of the wall or fence which forms the northern boundary of close number 729 and continuing thence southwards to and then generally eastwards along the last mentioned boundary and along the walls or fences which form the northern boundary of close number 728 and the northeastern boundary of close number 725 (thereby crossing an unnamed track or footpath) to a point on the wall or fence which divides close number 714a from close number 762 and continuing thence eastwards along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence which divides close number 722 from close number 762 to a point in the middle of a track or footpath which divides fields numbered 1 and 2 from fields numbered 3 and 4 (on the map) and continuing thence eastwards along the middle of the last mentioned track or footpath for a distance of $8\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite its eastern end in the middle of a second track or footpath running north and south through Big Wood and continuing thence southwards along the middle of the last mentioned track or footpath for a distance of $10\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point where it meets the track or footpath which forms the southwestern boundary of field numbered 4 and continuing thence southwards for a distance of $\frac{1}{2}$ chain or thereabouts to a point in the middle of a track or footpath which leads southeastwards through close number 1040 to Long Hill Road and continuing thence southeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned track or footpath to a point opposite its southeastern end in the middle of Long Hill Road and continuing thence southwestwards along the middle of Long Hill Road for a distance of $7\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite the eastern end of the wall or fence which forms the

northern boundary of close number 1050a and continuing thence westwards to and along the last mentioned boundary to its end and then southwards along the wall or fence which forms the western boundary of the last mentioned close to a point opposite its southern end in the middle of the Wokingham-Staines Road and continuing thence westwards along the middle of the Wokingham-Staines Road for a distance of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite the middle of the northeastern end of Allsmoor Lane and continuing thence generally southwestwards to and along the middle of Allsmoor Lane to a point where it crosses the middle of the railway line of the Staines and Wokingham Branch of British Railways (Southern Region) and continuing thence southeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned railway line to the boundary which divides the parish of Bracknell from the parishes of Ascot Heath and All Souls, South Ascot.”

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Oxford.

“We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and of the Diocesan Stipends Funds Measure, 1953, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Richard, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme) for effecting the unions of (1) the benefice of Great Thurlow and the benefice of Little Thurlow (now part of the benefice of Little Thurlow with Little Bradley), and (2) the benefice of Great Bradley and the benefice of Little Bradley (now part of the benefice of Little Thurlow with Little Bradley), all of which benefices are situate in the diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

“SCHEME.

“1. *Union of the Benefices of Great Thurlow and Little Thurlow.*

“(i) The benefice of Great Thurlow and the benefice of Little Thurlow, being part of the benefice of Little Thurlow with Little Bradley, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Great and Little Thurlow’, but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

“(ii) The union shall take effect upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette and the Reverend Edward Sebastian Barrington Barnes if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Great Thurlow shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

“(iii) Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Little Thurlow shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"(iv) With the consent (testified as aforesaid) of the Right Reverend Richard, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, being one of the patrons of the said benefice of Little Thurlow with Little Bradley, and with the consent of Ronald Arthur Vestey of Thurlow Hall, being the other patron of the said benefice of Little Thurlow with Little Bradley, and being also patron of the said benefice of Great Thurlow (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), the interest of the said Bishop in the patronage of the said benefice of Little Thurlow with Little Bradley shall be surrendered in favour of the said Ronald Arthur Vestey, and the patronage of the united benefice of Great and Little Thurlow shall belong wholly to the said Ronald Arthur Vestey.

"(v) Upon the union taking effect (a) the whole of the endowments and property then belonging to the benefice of Little Thurlow with Little Bradley with the exception of the capital sum mentioned in sub-paragraph (v) of clause 2 of this Scheme and (b) the whole of the endowments and property then belonging to the benefice of Great Thurlow shall be annexed to and together form part of the endowments of the united benefice of Great and Little Thurlow.

"(vi) Upon the union taking effect part of the endowment income of the united benefice, namely an annual sum of £164 10s. 6d., being an amount equivalent to the income arising on the proceeds of sale of the former parsonage house of the benefice of Great Thurlow now held by us for the benefit of the said benefice of Great Thurlow pursuant to subsection (3) of Section 5 of the Parsonages Measure, 1938, shall be paid to and be held by us for the benefit of the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

"2. Union of the Benefices of Great Bradley and Little Bradley.

"(i) The benefice of Great Bradley and the benefice of Little Bradley, being part of the benefice of Little Thurlow with Little Bradley, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Great and Little Bradley', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"(ii) The union shall take effect upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette and the Reverend Leonard Ernest West if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Little Thurlow with Little Bradley shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"(iii) Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Great Bradley shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"(iv) In every series of three successive turns of presentation to the united benefice after the union has taken effect the patron of the benefice of Great Bradley shall have the first and third turns and the said Ronald Arthur Vestey, being one of the patrons of the said benefice of Little Thurlow with Little Bradley shall have the second turn.

"(v) Upon the union taking effect a capital sum sufficient to produce £194 12s. 10d. per annum, being part of a larger capital sum at present held by us on behalf of the benefice of Little Thurlow with Little Bradley, shall be annexed to and shall be held by us on behalf of the united benefice and shall, together with the whole of the endowments and property then belonging to the benefice of Great Bradley, form part of the endowments of the united benefice."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

" SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Haslingden and the benefice of Saint Stephen, Haslingden Grane, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Haslingden with Saint Stephen, Haslingden Grane', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Fergus James McBride if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Haslingden shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Haslingden shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"(2) The said endowment income and the said surplus and the said annual sum of £557 shall be deemed to accrue from day to day and shall when we deem that circumstances so require be apportionable accordingly.

"(3) Any moneys due to us from the incumbent of the united benefice or, during any vacancy in the united benefice, from the sequestrators thereof, as the case may be (hereinafter called 'the incumbent or sequestrators'), upon the calculation of the said surplus shall be paid by the incumbent or sequestrators to us not later than the 30th June in each year and shall be recoverable as a debt due to us.

"(4) For the purpose of ascertaining the amounts of the said endowment income and of the said surplus, we shall have power to require production by the incumbent or sequestrators of accounts and other documents in relation thereto, and the said accounts for the twelve months to 31st March in each year (or where applicable for a part of the year ending on that date) shall be rendered annually to us within six weeks of that date in such form as we shall prescribe; and in the event of failure by the incumbent or sequestrators to produce such accounts or documents we shall have all legal remedies for enforcing production thereof.

"(2) all gross income received from ground rents, chief rents or other fixed charges, other glebe rents and any letting of the parsonage house or a formally divided portion thereof,

"and by deducting therefrom:—

"(1) the rates payable on the parsonage house if occupied by the incumbent,

"(2) the rent and rates payable on any house occupied by the incumbent other than the parsonage house,

"(3) the annual assessment charged upon the incumbent under the Ecclesiastical Dilapidations Measures, 1923 to 1951, in respect of the benefice,

"(4) the rates payable on the glebe,

"(5) the cost of collecting glebe rents,

"(6) any tithe annuity, rentcharge or fee farm rent charged upon the glebe,

"(7) any other outgoings in respect of the glebe,

"(8) any charge upon the benefice income in favour of another benefice or any lay person,
