GREENWICH HOSPITAL.

THE GREENWICH HOSPITAL (EDUCATION AND MAINTENANCE OF CHILDREN) ORDER, 1953.

Made - - - - - 19th November, 1953.
Laid before Parliament 20th November, 1953.
Coming into Operation 21st November, 1953.

At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 19th day of *November*, 1953.

PRESENT,

The **QUEEN's** Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Her Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Her by section five of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1885 (48 & 49 Vict. c. 42), and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The total number of boys and girls being educated and maintained under section five of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1872 (35 & 36 Vict. c. 67), at any one time shall not exceed one hundred and fifty.

2. The Order in Council made the twelfth day of December, 1885 (Rev. XXV, p. 326), under the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1885, is hereby revoked.

3. This Order may be cited as the Greenwich Hospital (Education and Maintenance of Children) Order, 1953, and shall come into operation on the twenty-first day of November, 1953.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PRESENT,

The **QUEEN's** Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 23rd day of October, 1953, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parishes of Edlington, Warmsworth and Conisbrough in the diocese of Sheffield and for altering the boundaries of the parish of Edlington and the parish of Conisbrough.

"SCHEME.

"Whereas, we, the Church Commissioners are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in Part I of the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish and that it is desirable that the boundaries of the parish of Edlington and the parish of Conisbrough should be altered in the manner described in Part II of the said Schedule:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment for the area to be constituted a new parish will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area described in Part I of the said Schedule as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Leslie, Bishop of Sheffield, (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

"1. (a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a minister, the area defined in Part I of the said Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint John the Baptist, New Edlington'.

"(d) The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Doncaster and in the rural deanery of Doncaster.

"2. As from the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme the boundaries of
