Norton Rural District Council (Kirby Grindalythe) Footpath Diversion Order, 1953.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 23rd day of November, 1953, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert the public right of way at Kirby Grindalythe running from the eastern corner of Field O.S. No. 68 to a point 60 yards westward thereof (marked A and B respectively on the map attached to the Order) to a line running from the point B referred to above for a distance of 40 yards in a south-easterly direction to join the existing footpath at a point, marked C on the map referred to, 42 yards south-west of the handgate marked on the said map.
