The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under section 19 of the Import Duties Act, 1932, section 14 of the Finance Act, 1933, and section 1 of the Import Duties (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1939, viz.:—

The Additional Import Duties (No. 3) Order, 1953, which alters the rates of duty chargeable under the Import Duties Act, 1932, on importations of certain fresh and preserved fruit and vegetables. The duties on certain goods have been

increased and some adjustments made in the periods during which the duties are operative; for other goods the seasonal specific duties hitherto in operation have been allowed to lapse, and the ordinary 10 per cent. general ad valorem duty restored. In two cases duties have been reduced.

Full details of the changes are given in the Memorandum published as Cmd. Paper No. 9018.

The Order comes into operation on the 1st December, 1953 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1953, No. 1736.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF ASSISTANT KEEPERS IN THE SCIENCE MUSEUM, MINISTRY OF EDUCATION.

1. *Sex and Marriage.* (i) Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widows or divorced, or who are separated from their husbands or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid. Provided that this undertaking will not be required if the break between the first period of service (including any period of unestablished service immediately following the period in respect of which the gratuity was paid) and the date of re-establishment is more than seven years.

2. *Age.*
