STOCKTON RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

Stockton Rural District Council (Egglescliffe) Extinguishment Order, 1953.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 23rd November, 1953, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed, with modifications, the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to extinguish the public right of way running for a distance of approximately 127 yards from the point marked "A" on the map accompanying the Order being the junction of the existing footpath with trunk road A.19 to the point marked "B" on the said map, being the junction of the existing footpath with another footpath running from Glebe Farm to Egglescliffe Village, both in the Parish of Egglescliffe. The said path will be closed as from the 15th December, 1953.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Council Offices, Cromer Lodge, Yarm Lane, Stockton-on-Tees, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m.

The Order becomes operative from the 27th November, 1953, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.
