NOTICE is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 30th day of November, 1953, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation. The Order relates to land situate in the Parish of Great Malvern.

The effect of the Order will be to create a public right of way on foot from an existing right of way running from Pickersleigh Road to Elmley Close at a point approximately Three hundred and sixteen feet from Pickersleigh Road at the South East part of Great Malvern Cemetery such public right of way running in a generally South Westerly direction to connect with Lower Wilton Road.

PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY.

Extinguishment Order.*
