Note.—The following diseases were eradicated from Great Britain in the years indicated:—Cattle plague or rinder-pest (pestis-bovina), 1877; pleuro-pneumonia (peripneumonia contagiosa bovum), 1898; sheep pox (variola ovium), 1850; rabies, 1922; epizootic lymphangitis (lymphangitis epizootica), 1906; and glanders (including farcy), (malleus), 1928 and parasitic mange (psoroptes et sarcoptes scabiei equi), 1948. Dourine (exanthema coitale paralyticum) has never existed in Great Britain.
