PETROLEUM (PRODUCTION) ACT, 1934.

Northern Boundary

From Tyler's Green the boundary follows A25 through Westerham to Sevenoaks. Thence it follows the road to Otford and continues via the Pilgrim's Way to Wrotham.

Eastern Boundary

From Wrotham this follows A227 through Borough Green as far as Towngate Wood. Thence it runs along the road through Coldharbour to the point where it meets the Hilden Brook which it follows as far as the bridge near the Grenadiers Inn. Thence it continues along the road past Hollandoak to the junction with A21 which it follows to Queen's Head Cottages. From here it follows the road through Sevenoaks Weald and Four Elms to Edenbridge. From here it continues by road through Markbeech, Chiddingstone Heath, Fordcombe, and Groombridge to Crowborough whence it follows A26 past Five Ash Down to the cross roads a little to the west of Cooper's Green.

Southern Boundary

This follows A22 through Maresfield and Nutley to Hillend Farm. Thence it continues along the road over Chelwood Common and on through Danehill, Horsted Keynes and Ardingly to Balcombe.

Western Boundary

This follows B2036 from Balcombe to Burleys Wood, where it joins A264. It continues along A264 as far as the junction at New Chapel with A22, which it follows to the commencement of the Northern Boundary.

3. An area of 165 sq. miles in the County of Sussex

Northern Boundary

From Cooper's Corner the boundary follows the road through Balcombe, Ardingly and Horsted Keynes to the road junction north east of Chelwood Common. Thence it turns south east along A22, through Maresfield to the cross-roads at Cooper's Green. From here it runs along B2102 through Buxted, Hadlow Down and Five Ashes to the point where it joins the river Rother which it follows to Crowhurst Bridge.

REGULATIONS FOR OPEN COMPETITIONS FOR SITUATIONS AS FEMALE POSTAL AND TELEGRAPH OFFICER IN THE POST OFFICE.

1. Age.

Candidates must be at least 16 and under 18 years of age on 1st March, 1954.

2. Nationality.

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

3. Health and Character.

Separate competitions will be held for each Head Post Office area, and candidates for each area will be arranged in order of merit on their aggregate of marks in the examination as a whole. Statutory Instruments 1954 No. 116.

*The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas)
Special Order No. 3, 1954.*

(Made 31st January, 1954.)

Extends the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Llanmartin, Newport, Monmouthshire, declared by Special Order No. 2, 1954, so as to include an area comprising the districts situate within approximately 15 miles of Raglan, Mon.

Statutory Instruments 1954 No. 121.

The Live Poultry (Restrictions) Order, 1954.

(Made 1st February, 1954.)

This Order includes a new provision (which came into force on 5th February) prohibiting the movement of poultry into an area comprising Wales and certain West Midland counties of England. It also revokes the Live Poultry (Restrictions) Order, 1952, as amended, with effect from 19th February, 1954, and replaces most of its provisions. Other provisions of the 1952 Order (relating to the keeping of records) are replaced by the Live Poultry (Movement Records) Order, 1954 (S.I. 1954/122) which also comes into operation on that date.

Apart from the prohibition of movement mentioned above and which came into force on 5th February, the principal changes (which come into force on 19th February, 1954), effected by the present Order are:—

(1) Guinea Fowls are now included in the expression "poultry" and are, therefore, subject to the provisions of the Order.

(2) The conditions under which poultry and day-old chicks produced on hatchery premises may be sold by auction without a licence now include one to the effect that they shall be moved direct from those premises to the premises of the purchaser.

(3) The conditions under which markets, fairs and sales of poultry may be licensed have been modified.

(4) The provision prohibiting a rearer from sending less than 25 birds to a store poultry market has been omitted.

(5) The expression "store poultry" is now so defined as to exclude birds under the age of one month (or nine days in the case of ducks).

(6) Dealers are now excluded from the class of persons who may send poultry to an authorised market of store poultry.

(7) The prohibition of the movement of poultry from premises onto which there has been a movement of live poultry within the previous 28 days is extended so as to apply also where within that period there has been a movement on to the premises of poultry carcasses (except carcasses intended for consumption thereon).

(8) Poultry removed from an exhibition may not now be moved within the following 28 days to the same or any other exhibition.

Statutory Instruments 1954 No. 122.

The Live Poultry (Movement Records) Order, 1954.

(Made 1st February, 1954.)

This Order requires poultry dealers and auctioneers to keep records of purchases and sales of poultry, and also, in the case of poultry dealers, of day-old chicks. It replaces similar provisions contained in the Live Poultry (Restrictions) Order, 1952 (S.I. 1952/200; 1952 III, p. 2619), which Order is revoked by the Live Poultry (Restrictions) Order, 1954 (S.I. 1954/121) on 19th February, 1954, the date on which the present Order comes into operation.

Throughout this Order any reference to a Sanitary Authority shall be construed as a reference to a Sanitary Authority within the meaning of the Public Health (Imported Food) Regulations, 1937 (S.R. & O. 1937 No. 329) as amended by the Public Health (Imported Food) (Amendment No. 2) Regulations, 1948 (S.I. 1948 No. 1121) (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations").

Whereas by Regulation 4 (1) of the Regulations it is provided that, subject to such provisions of the Regulations as prescribe functions to be exercised by the Officers of Customs and Excise and by the Medical Officer of Health and any other Officer of a Sanitary Authority, the Sanitary Authority shall enforce and execute the Regulations provided that if the Minister of Food shall by order so require, the enforcement and execution of the Regulations, inter alia, in a Metropolitan Borough shall be undertaken by the Local Authority and their Officers as if the Local Authority were a Sanitary Authority;

And whereas it is expedient that the Council of the Metropolitan Borough of Greenwich (hereinafter referred to as "the Greenwich Council") shall undertake the enforcement and execution of the Regulations within the district of that Borough as if they were a Sanitary Authority:

Now therefore, the Minister of Food, by this his Order made pursuant to Regulation 4 (1) of the Regulations, hereby requires that the Greenwich Council and their officers shall undertake the enforcement and execution of the Regulations within the district of the Metropolitan Borough of Greenwich as if the Greenwich Council were a Sanitary Authority and the Regulations shall have effect as if the Greenwich Council were a Sanitary Authority.

It is hereby further required that the Greenwich Council shall cause this Order to be published in the London Gazette.
