#### PETROLEUM (PRODUCTION) ACT, 1934.

In pursuance of section 2 (3) of the Petroleum (Production) Act, 1934, the Minister of Fuel and Power hereby gives notice that in accordance with the provisions of that Act and of the Petroleum (Production) Regulations, 1935, he has granted to D'Arcy Exploration Co., Ltd., Britannic House, Finsbury Circus, E.C.2, three prospecting licences, details of which are given in the schedule below. The boundaries are described from the 1 inch Ordnance Survey map supplemented where necessary by reference to the 6 inch Ordnance Survey map.

Maps showing boundaries of the areas may be inspected on application to the Ministry of Fuel and Power, Petroleum Division, Thames House South, Millbank, London, S.W.1.

#### SCHEDULE.

##### 1. An area of 175 sq. miles in the Counties of Kent and Sussex

A description of this area was published in the London Gazette of the 25th October, 1937.

##### 2. An area of 188 sq. miles in the Counties of Kent, Surrey and Sussex

###### Northern Boundary

From Tyler's Green the boundary follows A25 through Westerham to Sevenoaks. Thence it follows the road to Otford and continues via the Pilgrim's Way to Wrotham.

###### Eastern Boundary

From Wrotham this follows A227 through Borough Green as far as Towngate Wood. Thence it runs along the road through Coldharbour to the point where it meets the Hilden Brook which it follows as far as the bridge near the Grenadiers Inn. Thence it continues along the road past Hollandoak to the junction with A21 which it follows to Queen's Head Cottages. From here it follows the road through Sevenoaks Weald and Four Elms to Edenbridge. From here it continues by road through Markbeech, Chiddingstone Heath, Fordcombe, and Groombridge to Crowborough whence it follows A26 past Five Ash Down to the cross roads a little to the west of Cooper's Green.

###### Southern Boundary

This follows A22 through Maresfield and Nutley to Hillend Farm. Thence it continues along the road over Chelwood Common and on through Danehill, Horsted Keynes and Ardingly to Balcombe.

###### Western Boundary

This follows B2036 from Balcombe to Burleys Wood, where it joins A264. It continues along A264 as far as the junction at New Chapel with A22, which it follows to the commencement of the Northern Boundary.

##### 3. An area of 165 sq. miles in the County of Sussex

###### Northern Boundary

From Cooper's Corner the boundary follows the road through Balcombe, Ardingly and Horsted Keynes to the road junction north east of Chelwood Common. Thence it turns south east along A22, through Maresfield to the cross-roads at Cooper's Green. From here it runs along B2102 through Buxted, Hadlow Down and Five Ashes to the point where it joins the river Rother which it follows to Crowhurst Bridge.

###### Eastern Boundary

From Crowhurst Bridge the boundary follows the road through Burwash, Woods Corner and Bodlestree Green to the junction with A271 at Pope's Farm.

###### Southern Boundary

This follows A271 from Pope's Farm, near Windmill Hill, to the roundabout just beyond Lower Horsebridge. From here it runs along A22 as far as the road junction beyond Golden Cross whence it follows A273 through Laughton and Ringmer. It continues along the road past Barcombe Cross and Gallybird Hall to the junction with A275 at the Rainbow Inn. From here it runs north west along the road past Chailey Potteries, Plumpton Crossways and Ditchling Common into Folder Lane and Keymer Road as far as Burgess Hill Station.

###### Western Boundary

This follows the railway from Burgess Hill Station through Balcombe Station to Cooper's Corner.

#### Civil Service Commission, 9th February, 1954.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury, viz.:—

#### REGULATIONS FOR OPEN COMPETITIONS FOR SITUATIONS AS FEMALE POSTAL AND TELEGRAPH OFFICER IN THE POST OFFICE.

##### 1. Age.

Candidates must be at least 16 and under 18 years of age on 1st March, 1954.

##### 2. Nationality.

Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is or was at death a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

##### 3. Health and Character.

Successful candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character. They must be at least 5 feet in height.

##### 4. Examination.

The subjects of examination and the marks they will carry are as follows:—

(1) Arithmetic ... ..	100
(2) Spelling ... ..	25
(3) English ... ..	100
(4) General Paper ... ..	100

Separate competitions will be held for each Head Post Office area, and candidates for each area will be arranged in order of merit on their aggregate of marks in the examination as a whole. No candidate may compete for a vacancy in more than one area at the same time, but if after the results of the examination have been published the number of qualified candidates in any area is insufficient to fill the vacancies in that area appointments may be offered, in order of their total marks, to candidates who have been unsuccessful for appointments in other areas in the same Post Office Region. Even if
